Potential for severe weather returns this evening with the western portion of the combined Panhandles seeing the best odds. As it stands, latest guidance is suggesting that development of any severe storm could lead to one inch hail and wind gust up to 60 mph. However, that potential is also expected to be limited this afternoon with severe storms expected to be more isolated.



A few severe thunderstorms are possible this afternoon through this evening mainly near the TX/NM state line. Wind gusts near 60 mph, hail to quarter size, and locally heavy rainfall will be possible with the strongest storms.



Showers and storms are possible Tuesday, particularly across western Oklahoma and western north Texas.






Storms once again make an appearance to the west over the mountains and southeast New Mexico this afternoon and into this evening. A few storms may be severe with large hail and damaging winds as the main threats.






