





Thunderstorms are expected across the southeast Texas Panhandle early Wednesday afternoon and evening with the movement of cold front. The position of the cold front will ultimately dictate where storms initiate and for how long, the strongest of which will be capable of large hail, damaging winds, and flooding rainfall.




Severe thunderstorms are likely this afternoon and evening, mainly east of a line from Denver City to Plainview to Silverton. Supercells capable of producing hail up to baseball size, damaging winds to 65 mph, and even a few tornadoes will be possible. Torrential rainfall at times will lead to some flooding, especially in the Rolling Plains.




Scattered to widespread thunderstorms are expected today and tonight. Any storm that develops will likely produce heavy rain. Most can expect to receive between 1.5-3" of rain, but isolated locations across parts of East and Northeast Texas will receive as much as 5-5.5" of rain.



A few strong to severe storms capable of damaging wind gusts and hail are possible on Wednesday, especially during the afternoon and evening. Additional more widespread rainfall will arrive overnight into early Thursday morning, and there will be a threat for heavy rain and flooding.



Widespread showers and storms are developing again today, with the highest chances for rain near and along the coast. The greatest threat for flooding rains will be south and southwest of Houston, over locations that saw heavy rain yesterday. That rain will make those locations much more sensitive if heavy rain falls on them again today.



A few strong to severe thunderstorms are possible late this afternoon and evening across northern and western portions of West Central Texas.



Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms are possible this afternoon. Otherwise, partly cloudy skies and hot temperatures are expected today.




Highs end up in the mid to upper 80s with a few spots in the low 90s. Much like yesterday, storms will develop this afternoon across the Stockton Plateau north towards the Permian Basin and linger into this evening. Some storms may become severe and may be capable of large hail and damaging winds.






