




Heavy rainfall may lead to flash flooding/flooding across portions of the area from Wednesday afternoon into early Thursday morning. The highest risk is across south central Oklahoma and north Texas.




The threat for flash flooding will increase today, especially west of I-35. Heavy rainfall and slow-moving thunderstorms will increase the risk for flooding, especially in areas that experienced rainfall yesterday. Widespread 2-4" of rain expected with a 10% chance of 5+ inches of rain in the dark green shaded region. In addition, there will be a threat for strong to isolated severe storms capable of hail and strong winds.





Multiple rounds of showers and thunderstorms are possible from this morning through tonight. Heavy rainfall will accompany some of this activity, with isolated flooding impacts possible over primarily the southern Edwards Plateau and western Hill Country.




Isolated to scattered streamer showers continue to trickle in from the Gulf this morning. We will continue to see a chance for some showers and storms across the Coastal Plains and Brush Country this afternoon. Mostly cloudy conditions are expected with temperatures topping out in the mid 80s to low 90s.




Fire Danger Forecast



Burn Ban




Keetch-Byram Drought Index
