




There will be a threat for strong to severe thunderstorms across north Louisiana and south Arkansas this afternoon into this evening. Damaging winds and large hail will be the primary threats, but tornadoes cannot be ruled out.



A round of strong to severe thunderstorms are expected late Saturday afternoon into Saturday night. Damaging winds and frequent lightning will be the primary impacts from these storms.





Elevated fire weather is possible across the southeast New Mexico plains and adjacent plains to the Guadalupe Mountains this afternoon. Avoid activities that may generate a flame or spark, properly dispose of cigarettes, and do not drive or pull over in dead grass




A cold front will move through the region today. Expect cloudy and foggy conditions south of the front this morning, with clearing skies and breezy conditions this afternoon and evening.



A Freeze Watch is in effect late tonight through early Sunday morning for the Presidio Valley. Temperatures will fall as low as 27 degrees. Be sure to protect outdoor plants or exposed pipes from these very cold temperatures.


