
Monday brings snow and strong winds to the Oklahoma and Texas Panhandles. Different impacts are expected depending on where you live. In the north and western Panhandles, the strongest gusts are expected to combine with moderate snow to create blizzard conditions, and travel should be avoided if at all possible. With less snow expected toward the east and south, those areas should see a bit lower impact but could still have gusts to 60 mph, necessitating extra caution if you must travel.




Showers and storms will develop west of I-35 early this morning, then spread east across the I-35 corridor mid to late morning, then across the far eastern the eastern counties early this afternoon. A few strong to severe storms may occur, mainly across eastern portions of Central Texas. Hail and gusty winds will be the primary hazards.



Forecast for today. Slight chance of severe storms ahead of a cold front.






A strong to severe line of thunderstorms is expected to impact the morning commute. Expect damaging winds to be the main concern with this activity.



A Red Flag Warning has been issued from 9am-9pm Monday. Gusty northwest wind and low humidity will lead to pockets of high to critical fire danger across portions of the southern Edwards Plateau and Rio Grande Plains. Practice fire safety and avoid activities that create sparks.



Although not the primary story for this lowpressure system, there is a Marginal to Slight Risk of severe storms across eastern areas with all modes of severe storms possible.




Strong northwest winds are expected in the wake of a cold front this afternoon will lead to critical fire weather conditions. Winds are expected to gust as high as 45 mph combined with relative humidity values below 30%. Please use extreme caution if handling open flames or hot objects over vegetation.



High wind warnings go into effect this morning for the Trans Pecos and western high terrain with Wind Advisories in the Permian Basin and Rio Grande Valley through Monday evening. Wind gusts could be as high as 35-55 mph in the plains and 60-70+ mph in the warning with even high gusts possible in the highest elevations. Driving will be difficult in the strong winds and blowing dust may reduce visibility. Secure those loose objects now!



A Red Flag Warning is in effect this morning through this evening for portions of the Lower Trans Pecos, Big Bend, and Rio Grande Valley. Very dry conditions and very strong winds will result in critical fire weather conditions across these area. Do NOT do any outdoor burning and do NOT pull over into dead grass!




Dangerously cold wind chills are expected both Monday morning and Tuesday morning. Values will be -15 to 0 degrees in the mountains and 5 to 20 degrees across the lowlands.



Fire Danger Forecast




Burn Ban

Keetch-Byram Drought Index


