STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On January 7, Governor Greg Abbott directed the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM), State Operations Center (SOC), to Level II (Escalated Response) as the state prepares for multiple weather threats.

The National Weather Service (NWS) stated a system of storms will begin Monday, January 8. These storms will include strong winds, snow, critical fire weather conditions, and severe thunderstorms. Snowfall and dangerous wind chills are expected to impact the Panhandle. Fire weather conditions are anticipated in West and Southwest Texas. Severe thunderstorms with large hail, heavy rainfall, and flash flooding threats are expected to impact East and Southeast Texas. Strong winds are possible across the state with gusts reaching 60-70 miles per. Texans are encouraged to monitor local weather forecasts.

TDEM has requested the following agencies report to the SOC for emergency support services.

- **Texas Department of Transportation:** Pre-treating and treating of roadways and monitoring road conditions has begun.
- **Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service (Texas A&M Task Force 1):** Urban Search & Rescue Teams, Swiftwater Boat Squads, and a Water Group Supervisor have been called up.
- **Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):** Firefighting personnel, heavy equipment (including motor graders for snow removal), saw crews, and Incident Management Teams are on standby.

- **Texas Department of State Health Services (Texas Emergency Medical Task Force):** Are ready to provide Winter and Severe Weather Packages.
- **Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):** TCEQ is monitoring air, water, and wastewater.
- **Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service:** 22 Disaster assessment and recovery agents are on standby.
- **Texas Animal Health Commission (TAHC):** TAHC is coordinating animal and agricultural resources.
- **Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUC):** Power outage is being monitored and coordination has begun with utility providers across the threat area.
- **The Railroad Commission of Texas (RRC):** Monitoring of the state’s natural gas supply has begun with communication to the oil and gas industry.
- **Texas Department of Public Safety (TXDPS):** Texas Highway Patrol Troopers and the Tactical Marine Units are on standby.
- **Texas Parks & Wildlife Department (TPWD):** Game Wardens and Boat Squads are on standby.
- **Texas National Guard:** Personnel and equipment to support response efforts are on standby.
- **Texas Department of Information Resources:** Technology infrastructure is being monitored.
- **Texas Education Agency:** School districts across the state are being monitored.
- **Texas Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (Texas VOAD):** Coordination of volunteer organizations across the state for response has begun.

Texans are urged to make an emergency plan, follow instructions from local officials and first responders, and keep an emergency supply kit. Texans can access weather safety information by visiting [TexasReady.gov](https://www.texasready.gov), locate warming centers at tdem.texas.gov/warm, check road conditions at [DriveTexas.org](https://www.drive-texas.org), and obtain flood tracking information at [TexasFlood.org](https://www.texasflood.org).

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

1. Protect life and property.
2. Support rapid & effective response.
3. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decision-making.
4. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

DD 1 – Amarillo (Includes Armstrong, Briscoe, Carson, Castro, Childress, Collingsworth, Dallam, Deaf Smith, Donley, Gray, Hall, Hansford, Hartley, Hemphill, Hutchinson, Lipscomb, Moore, Ochiltree, Oldham, Parmer, Potter, Randall, Roberts, Sherman, Swisher, and Wheeler Counties)

DD 1 – Amarillo: [DDEOC 1 returned to Level IV on January 9.](#)

TxDOT and TPWD: There were 2 calls on January 8 for stranded motorists and both agencies continue to search for stranded motorists.

DD 2 – Lubbock (Includes Bailey, Cochran, Crosby, Dickens, Floyd, Garza, Hale, Hockley, King, Lamb, Lubbock, Lynn, Motley, Terry, and Yoakum Counties)

DD 2 – Lubbock: DDEOC 2 has been activated to Level III.

Region 8 (Includes DDs 11, 12, 13, and 23)

DD 13 – Bryan (Includes Brazos, Burleson, Grimes, Leon, Madison, Robertson, and Washington Counties)

Leon County: Wind has blown a radio antenna onto adjacent power lines causing a temporary power outage in the Hilltop Lakes area.

DD 23 – Killeen (Includes Bell, Coryell, Hamilton, Lampasas, Milam, Mills, and San Saba Counties)

The Hamilton Municipal Airport incurred damage from severe weather with multiple buildings destroyed on January 8.

STATE RESOURCES COMMITTED

Texas Division of Emergency Management:

Mass Care ESF6: was activated at 10:00 hours, on January 8.

Sheltering: [37 seasonal relief centers are open as of 11:45 PM, January 9.](#)

Food Services: None.

Distribution of Supplies: None.

Reunification: None.

State and VOAD partners remain on standby ready to support Mass Care services at the local level.

Incident Support Task Force (I.S.T.F): HQ and regional staff are actively assessing the weather and communicating with locals for any unmet needs.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service (TEEX):

At the request of TDEM, Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service (TEEX) has activated Texas A&M Task Force 1(TX-TF1) for Type 3 US&R teams, Type 3 Swift

Water Boat Squads (consisting of 4 boats), and a Water Group Supervisor Package. 63 personnel are assigned.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):

TPWD has prepared resources consisting of Texas Game Wardens and State Park Police Officers to support as needed.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 1 (TEEX/TX-TF1): All TX-TF1 resources started demobilizing the evening of January 9.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Task Force 2 (TEEX/TX-TF2): TX-TF2 is on standby.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service Texas Public Works Response Team (TEEX/TX-PWRT): TX-PWRT continues to support and coordinate operations.

Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Services:

22 Disaster Assessment and Recovery agents, County Extension Strike Team members, and the Texas Animal Health Commission, are on standby to support ESF11 for animal response and recovery efforts.

Texas A&M AgriLife Marketing and Communications has distributed preparedness and educational resources through the Texas EDEN website and the county agent network to support local governments.

Slide sets were pushed out to State, Regional and District Extension Administration for situational awareness.

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS):

TAMFS has activated the Amarillo Office for snow removal and response operations. TxDOT Amarillo District and the local TFS Office are clearing roads.

Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ):

TCEQ has staff available for air, water (including potable water), and waste response.

Texas Department of Public Safety (TXDPS):

TXDPS Troopers in the Panhandle area are actively monitoring road conditions as temperatures drop and anticipate an increase in calls for service. TXDPS stands ready to provide assistance.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD):

TPWD has prepared resources consisting of Texas Game Wardens and State Park Police Officers to support as needed.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT):

- Crews in Amarillo, Lubbock, Childress have cleared and reopened all road closures.
- Amarillo, Lubbock, El Paso and Childress districts remain staffed for 24-hour operations in response to winter storm, if needed. Crews continue to pretreat and monitor roadways.
- TxDOT continues to use DMS to provide travel information and alternate routes.
- All 25 districts are monitoring lingering weather threats and have crews ready to respond to any needs.
- Impacted TxDOT district EOCs are staffed, as needed.
