The arctic air will remain across the area for the next few days, which will lead to cold morning temperatures and wind chills. The forecast wind chills for Sunday morning will be in the -10 to -30 degrees range. Make sure to limit time spent outside during these cold conditions!



Today will be cold with highs in the teens and 30s. Breezy winds will lead to negative Wind Chill values in the morning. Make sure to wear proper winter clothing if outside, especially in the morning.




A Wind Chill Advisory is now in effect for portions of North Texas today and Monday. Minimum wind chills between 1 below zero and 12 below zero are expected in the advisory area. The Wind Chill Advisory will expand to all areas Monday night through midday Tuesday. Minimum wind chills between 1 below zero and 12 below zero are expected across the entire region.

A Winter Storm Warning and a Winter Weather Advisory are now in effect through Monday afternoon. For our zones in pink along and north of I-20, sleet and snowfall accumulations of 1-2 inches are expected, with locally higher amounts possible. Areas between I-20 and I-30 could also see freezing rain and ice accumulations between a tenth and a quarter of an inch. The Winter Weather Advisory area south of I-20 will see freezing rain and sleet accumulations of 0.1 to 0.2 tenths of an inch.



A Winter Weather Advisory will be in effect from 6pm this evening through 6pm Monday. Freezing rain mixed with sleet may lead to icy patches on elevated roadways, so be sure to exercise caution while traveling.

At this time Vernon, Rapides, Avoyelles parishes and Tyler, Northern Jasper, Northern Newton counties have been listed under a Winter Weather Advisory this coming Monday (Jan 15th) with primary threat being freezing rain.



A Winter Weather Advisory will be in effect late tonight through midday Monday. As colder air surges into the region, our threat for freezing rain will increase. Travel may be hazardous as you head out the door tomorrow. Stay safe.




Dangerously cold wind chills are expected again tonight and Monday night. Tonight, wind chills will be in the single digits across most of the Permian Basin and Southeast New Mexico, with 20s along the Pecos River, and 30s southwest. Monday night and Tuesday morning, stronger winds will produce subzero and single digit wind chills for a majority of the area, with some locations across Southeast New Mexico and the northern Permian Basin approaching 15 degrees below zero.






