




Temperatures today will struggle to rise once again, with highs in the single digits in the northwestern Panhandles to perhaps the lower 20s in the southwestern Texas Panhandle.



Wind Chill Warnings and Advisories are in effect from 6 pm this evening until 10 am CST on Tuesday. Wind chill values will be lowest this evening as a backdoor cold front moves through the region increasing winds to 15 to 20 mph with gusts to 30 mph. These winds will diminish early Tuesday morning. The very cold wind chills may result in frostbite, frozen skin, or hypothermia. Avoid extended time outside and keep pets indoors as much as possible.



Travel impacts vary greatly across North and Central Texas this morning. The most widespread and significant impacts are across central North Texas, including the Metroplex, and across eastern Central Texas. Many surface roads across North Texas are covered with snow and are slick. Ice and sleet on roads across eastern Central Texas will make travel dangerous! Please avoid travel if you are in these areas unless necessary. Elsewhere, most roads are dry with little to no travel impacts.



With overnight low temperatures forecast to fall to less than 20 degrees across much of the Ark-La-Tex north of I-20. A Hard Freeze Warning is now in effect for tonight.



A Winter Weather Advisory will be in effect through 6 PM this evening. Freezing rain mixed with sleet may lead to icy patches on elevated roadways, so be sure to exercise caution while traveling.

Slicks spots may cause some issues on area roadway, which will result from a wintry mix of snow, sleet and freezing drizzle.



Winter Storm Warnings and Weather Advisories continue through noon today with ice accumulations between 0.01" and 0.10" expected. Icy roadways, especially bridges and overpasses, along with slippery sidewalks are possible.



A cold day is in store across the region with highs struggling to reach the mid 30s for much of the region. It's possible that the Victoria Crossroads do not climb above freezing today. Freezing rain and drizzle will remain possible through early this afternoon. Otherwise, expect a northerly wind with wind chills maxing out in the mid 20s to near 30 this afternoon.



A Wind Chill Advisory is in effect for Zapata, Jim Hogg, Brooks, Kenedy, Starr, and Hidalgo counties until 1 PM this afternoon for dangerous wind chill values less than 30 degrees, including a few locations in the ranchlands near or below 20 degrees. A Wind Chill Warning will be in effect this evening into Tuesday afternoon.



Dangerously cold wind chills are expected again tonight into Tuesday morning. Widespread wind chill values of 5 to 10 degrees below zero are expected across the Permian Basin, Lea County, the Lower Trans Pecos, and the Davis Mountains and Davis Mountains Foothills, where a Wind Chill Advisory is in effect. Portions of the northern Permian Basin and Lea County may see wind chills between 10 and 14 below. Cover all exposed skin before going outdoors, prolonged exposure could lead to frostbite. Limit time spent outside in the cold.







#### **Burn Ban**




### **Keetch-Byram Drought Index**
