
Temperatures may briefly reach freezing this afternoon before climbing into the 40s to 60s Wednesday and Thursday afternoon. Unfortunately, highs may remain just below freezing for Friday.



Chill Warning Wind across the far The **Panhandle** southwestern Texas has been downgraded to a Wind Chill Advisory. The Wind Chill Advisory across the far southeastern Texas Panhandle, Rolling Plains, and portions of the South Plains remains in effect until 10 AM CST. Wind chill values as low as 14 degrees below zero can be expected. Continue to exercise cautions if outside as exposed skin may become quickly frostbitten.



Exceptionally cold weather will persist morning with temperatures in the teens and single digits and wind chill values as low as minus 10 degrees around daybreak. A Wind Chill Advisory is in effect for all of North & Central Texas until Noon and a Hard Freeze Warning is in effect for North TX and the Big Country until 10 AM.




Overnight low temperatures are forecast to fall to less than 20 degrees across the Ark-La-Tex. A Hard Freeze Warning is now in effect until 11am **CST Wednesday.**

A Wind Chill Advisories and Warning are in effect through noon Tuesday. Very cold temperatures combined with north winds will produce wind chill values between -5 and 10 degrees.





For the Hill Country to across the Austin Metro area, a Wind Chill Warning remains in effect through 9 AM this morning, then a Wind Chill Advisory through 10 AM Wednesday. For the remainder of South-Central Texas, a Wind Chill Advisory remains in effect through 10 AM Wednesday. Wind chills ranging from 10 degrees below zero to zero in the Warning and zero to 10 degrees above zero in the Advisory are expected. Bring pets inside and limit time outdoors. Dress layered and stay covered.



A Hard Freeze Warning is currently in effect for much of the region through noon today. A Freeze Warning is in effect for the island. Another round of Hard Freeze and Freeze Warnings will be in effect tonight as temps fall back into the 20s.



A Freeze and Hard Freeze Warning is in effect beginning late tonight into tomorrow morning for Deep South Texas.



Dangerously cold wind chills are expected through this morning. Widespread wind chill values of 5 to 10 degrees below zero are expected across the Permian Basin, Trans Pecos, Southeast New Mexico, Stockton Plateau, Culberson County, and the Davis Mountains. Cover all exposed skin before going outdoors, prolonged exposure could lead to frostbite. Limit time spent outside in the cold.






