


There is a slight chance of light freezing rain or sleet this morning across the South Plains. Amounts are expected to remain very light and little or no ice accumulation is expected. Later on, temperatures will warm above freezing with a plain cold rain expected this afternoon. The best chances of afternoon rainfall will be across the Rolling Plains.



Light freezing rain is possible across the Big Bend and Lower Trans Pecos Sunday morning. Little to no accumulation will limit impacts to mainly bridges.



Freezing rain chances begin as early as 4 PM. Impacts to travel are possible quickly after onset.



A low impact freezing weather event is expected Sunday evening and night. The main impacts will be along the Red River/Texoma region, where ice may temporarily accumulate on bridges and overpasses. Closer to the I-20 corridor, most roads and bridges will remain ice free. A few of the highest overpasses may experience temporary ice patches. Any icy conditions will improve by sunrise as temperatures increase above freezing.



A winter weather advisory is in effect overnight tonight.




There is a 20-30% of patchy freezing rain and sleet across portions of the the Edwards Plateau and Hill Country Sunday morning. If any ice were to occur it would be on elevated surfaces such as windshields and outdoor decking. No significant travel impacts are currently expected.


Fire Danger Forecast
