


Widespread light to moderate rain is expected for much of the area today with areas along and east of I-35 picking up as much as 2 inches through this evening. Another round of showers and some thunderstorms are expected on Tuesday which could bring an additional 2-3 inches of rain. Rainfall totals of 3 to 5 inches will be possible across parts of our southeast counties through Tuesday. Flooding of low-lying areas will be possible.



A Winter Weather Advisory is in effect from 10 pm this evening through 9 am Monday for McCurtain County Oklahoma and neighboring sections of southwest Arkansas and northeast Texas. Areas of light freezing rain are expected to begin moving into the Advisory area late this evening through the overnight hours. Ice accumulations amounts of up to a tenth of an inch will be possible.

#### **Hazardous Weather**



Here is the forecast for additional rainfall expected on Monday. The heaviest rainfall is expected along the Interstate 35 corridor and east into the coastal plains and Highway 77 corridor. Be prepared for a slow morning commute and remain alert for ponding of water on roadways and isolated spots of flooding.




Numerous showers and scattered thunderstorms will continue tonight. Occasional heavy downpours will be possible at times and may lead to localized flooding.




### Fire Danger Forecast



#### **Burn Ban**




#### **Keetch-Byram Drought Index**
