


Wind Speeds








While visibility could improve this afternoon, we expect the dense fog to return this evening and persist through Wednesday morning. Drive carefully, use your low beams, and be alert for ice on bridges as the temperature may be around freezing in some areas.



A Marginal Risk of severe weather is highlighted for mainly Deep East Texas into West Central and East Central Louisiana. The bigger threat through today will be excessive heavy rainfall and that threat will exist across the entire Four State Region.



The threat for locally heavy rainfall continues today where a Marginal Risk (level 1 of 4) for excessive rainfall is aligned along and east of the I-35 corridor and a Slight Risk (level 2 of 4) remains in effect across portions of the Coastal Plains.



Patchy fog will develop over much of South Texas this morning. Fog will dissipate around 9 AM over land, and by noon over the waters then numerous showers and scattered thunderstorms are expected today, with the strongest storms expected over the northern Coastal Plains and Victoria Crossroads. A few storms could be strong to severe



Persistent cloud coverage will keep temperatures in the range of upper 70s to low 80s. Light and variable winds are expected for today. Isolated showers and thunderstorms are still possible with some being strong and producing heavy rainfall. Adverse marine conditions are present for the offshore Gulf waters.




