

- Heavy rain/flash flooding potential across N/Ctrl/E/SETX, SE
 OK on Friday and E/SETX, E OK, AR, LA on Saturday.
- Marginal risk of isolated strong/severe storms for N/Ctrl/STX on Friday.
- Minor/isolated moderate river flooding across E/SETX, AR, LA.



5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status

Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall

Impacts to agricultural and recreational areas.


Trinity River at Liberty will drop below major today and remain in moderate through Thursday. Roads into several outlying communities above Liberty are closed with residents in 5 or 6 subdivisions cut off.


Forecast rainfall Friday/Saturday may prolong ongoing minor river flooding and/or lead to new minor river flooding in E/SETX,AR, LA. Very low chance of new moderate river flooding.






Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities








Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities







"Day 3-7" Hazards Outlook









'Day 8-14" Hazards Outlook








Green	Very Common Safety: Rarely a Direct Threat to Life and Property Impact Potential: Typically Results in Little Inconvenience to Daily Routines	Severe: Marginal Risk from SPC Flooding: Minor flooding expected over localized areas Tropical: None Fire Weather: No Watches/Warnings, fuel moisture above 10% or green up active	Thunderstorms expected over LA this afternoon; a few may produce winds to knock down a few trees Something that happens almost every day in a particular season such as sea breeze storms in coastal TX

Purple	Very Rare — Once Every 5-10 Years Safety: Property Damage Unavoidable, Immediate Action to Save Life will be Needed Impact Potential: Typically Results in Long-Lived Widespread Major Disruption to Daily Life	Severe: High Risk from SPC Flooding: Major flooding expected over a widespread area (including urban locations) Tropical: A Major Hurricane (Cat3 or greater) expected to move towards or near any coastline Fire: Large area of critical conditions for 2 or more days, Warnings for 3 or more days, Long term (months) of severe to extreme drought	 A Category 4 hurricane is headed towards the SE LA; major storm surge, flooding and damaging winds anticipated to begin tomorrow Widespread severe storms expected, tornado outbreak probable with long- lived, very widespread and particularly intense storms
