Wednesday | Extreme Fire Weather







WHEN: Noon to 7 PM CDT Wednesday.
WINDS: Southwest 20 to 30 mph, gusts up to 40 mph.
RELATIVE HUMIDITY: As low as 10 percent.
TEMPERATURES: Up to 84.
IMPACTS: Any fires that develop will spread rapidly.
Outdoor burning is strongly discouraged





Very dry, warm, and windy weather expected this afternoon. The driest and windiest weather will be over west central portions of Oklahoma, where extreme fire weather conditions are forecast. All outdoor burning, and other activities that could create a spark, should be avoided.





A Red Flag Warning is in effect for Southeast New Mexico, the northern/western Permian Basin, and into the Davis Mountains this morning through this evening. Very dry and breezy conditions will likely combine for critical fire weather conditions. Avoid any outdoor burning and properly dispose of cigarettes!




A High Wind Warning is in effect for the Guadalupe and Delaware Mountains this afternoon and evening with a Wind Advisory for the adjacent plains of Eddy/Culberson counties as well as north-central Lea County. Winds could gust up to 55 mph in the plains and up to 75 mph at Guadalupe Pass. Strong winds may make driving difficult, especially through Guadalupe Pass! Avoid travel in the area if you can.



Fire Danger Forecast




Burn Ban

Keetch-Byram Drought Index


