# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Thursday, March 14, 2024

## Summary of the Upcoming Week

- Slight to enhanced risk of severe thunderstorms with heavy rain across E OK, N/NETX, AR today.
  - Very large hail/damaging wind/tornado threat from late afternoon into early Friday morning.
- Marginal to slight risk of severe storms with heavy rain from SCTX into W LA on Friday with heavy rain threat continuing over S/SETX, S LA through the weekend.
- Heavy snow and winds gusting to 50 mph in NM will have travel impacts for I-40 and I-25.
- Minor river flooding lingers in NW/SE LA.



Minor river flooding in NW LA and SE LA.


Approximately 20 homes threatened near the gauge along the Pearl River in SE LA.




Slight risk of heavy rain/flash flooding across SE OK, NETX, AR and N LA.







#### Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities












