FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Friday, March 15, 2024

Summary of the Upcoming Week

- **Marginal to slight risk of severe storms with heavy rain/localized flash flooding from SW TX into LA through the weekend.**
- **Heavy snow and winds gusting to 50 mph in NM will have travel impacts for I-40 and I-25 through Saturday morning.**
- **Minor river flooding lingers in NW/SE LA and anticipated rises in E TX this weekend.**

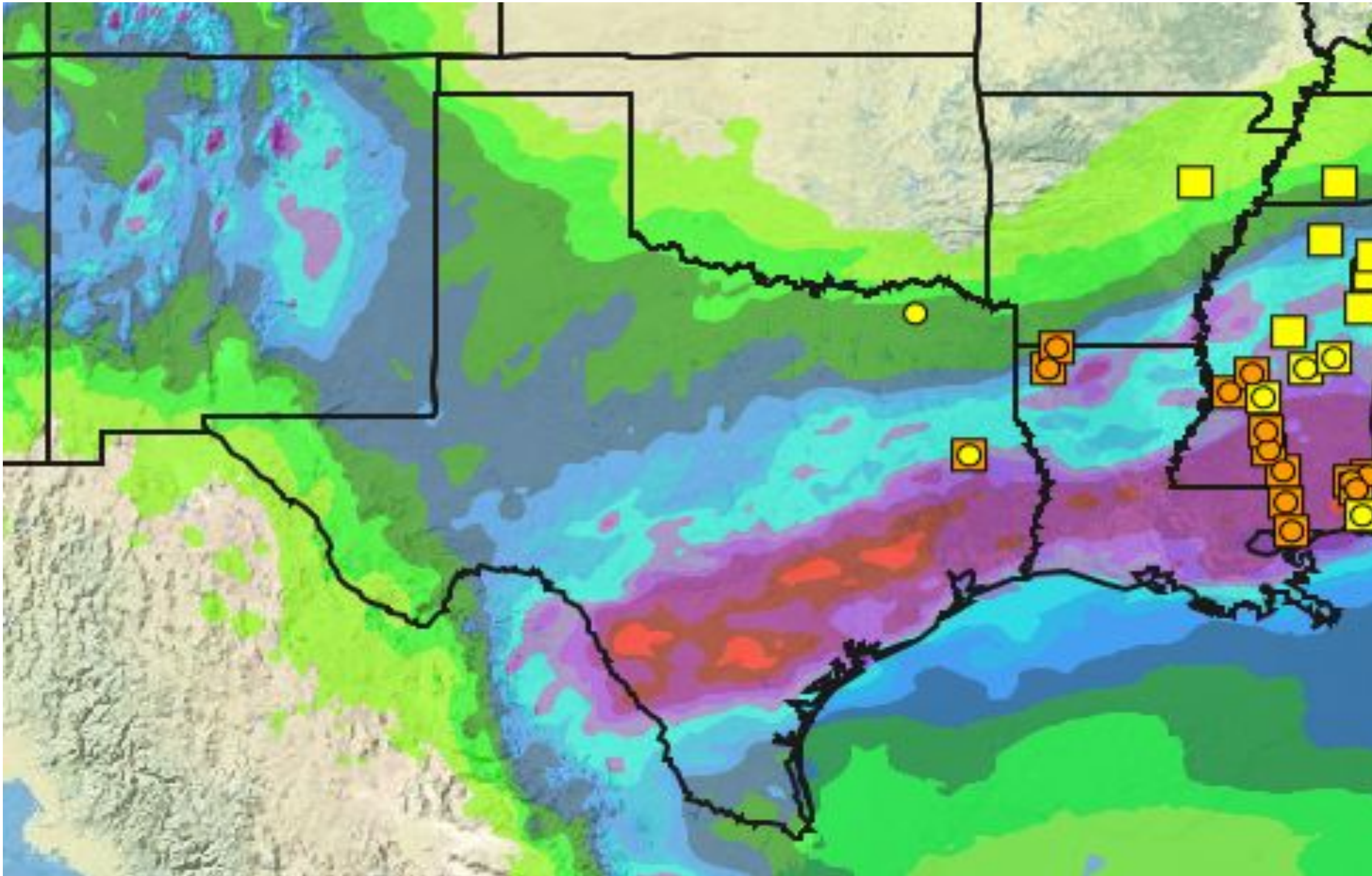

Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall



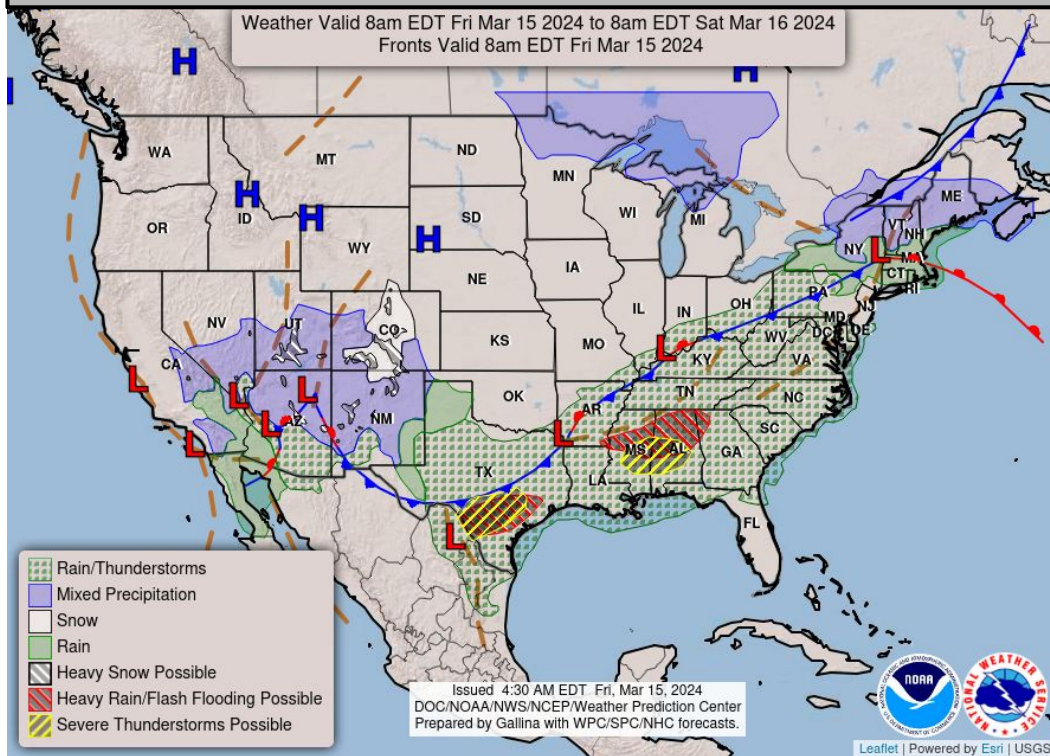

Winter Storm Warnings across NM through Saturday morning.

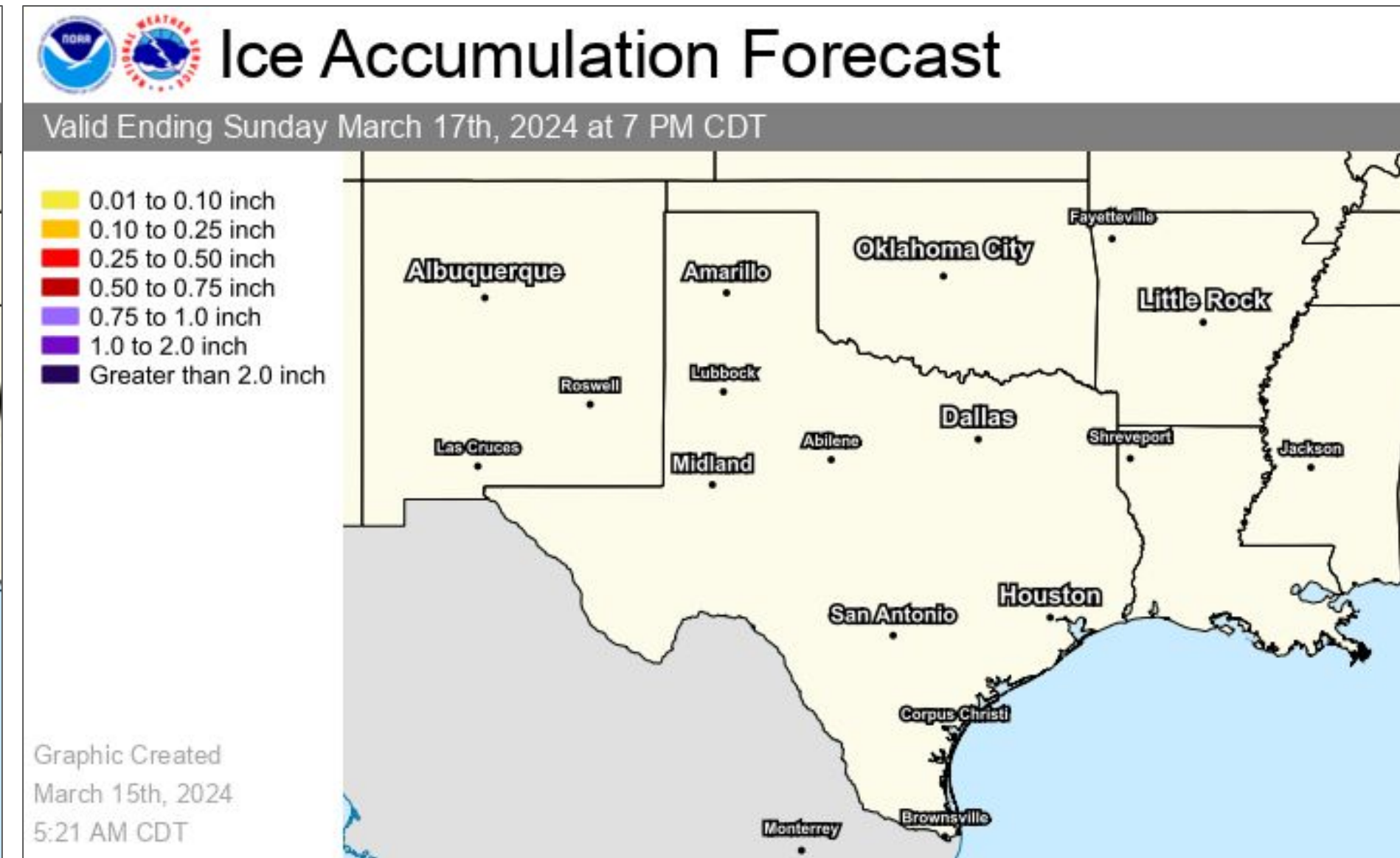
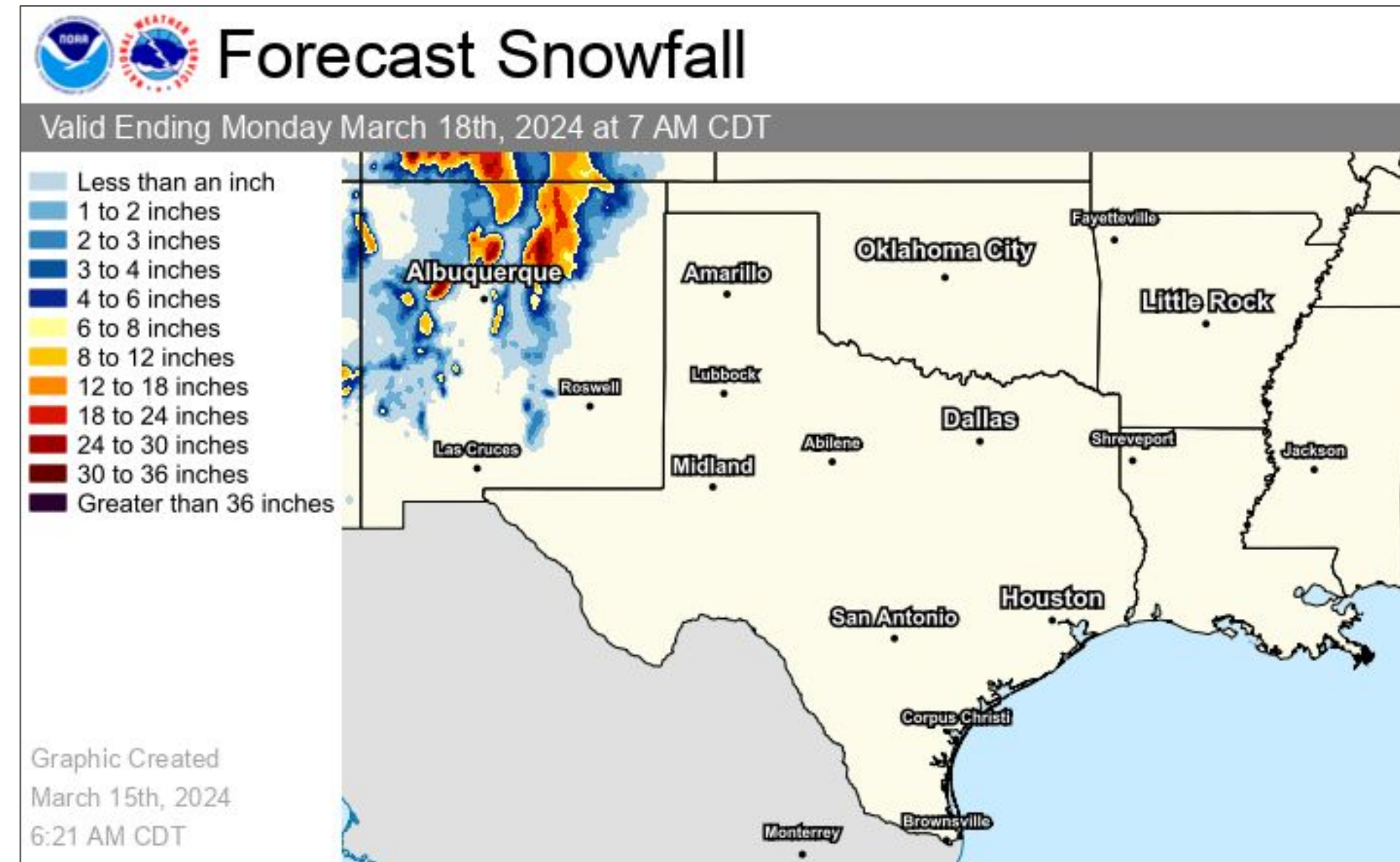

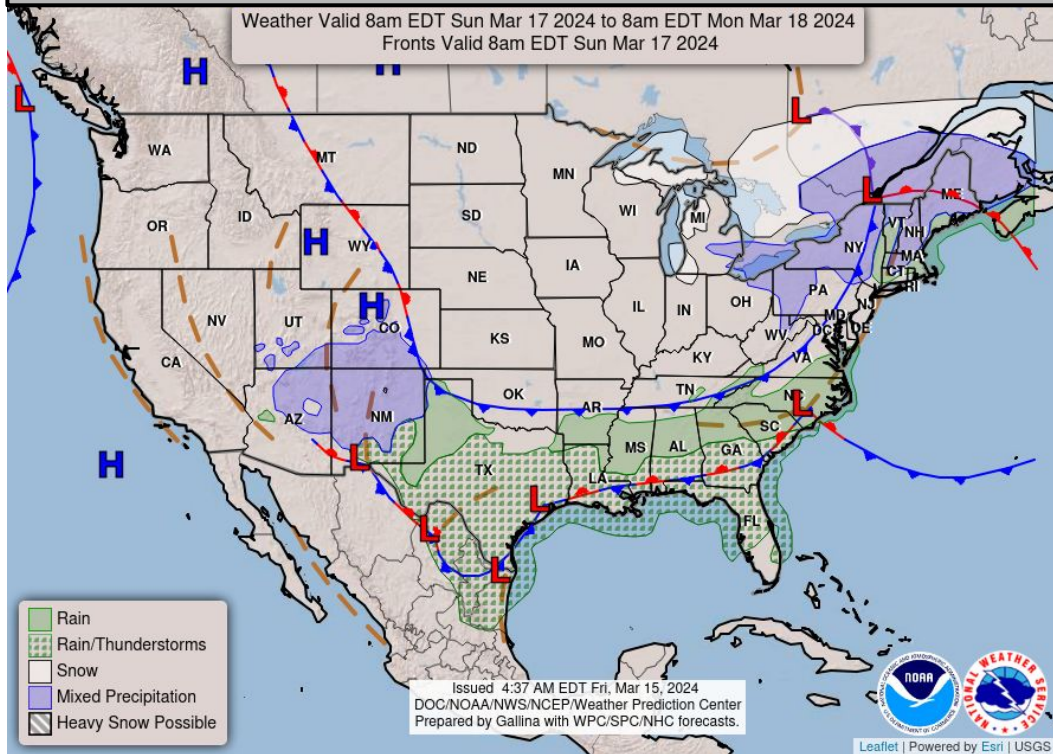
Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities



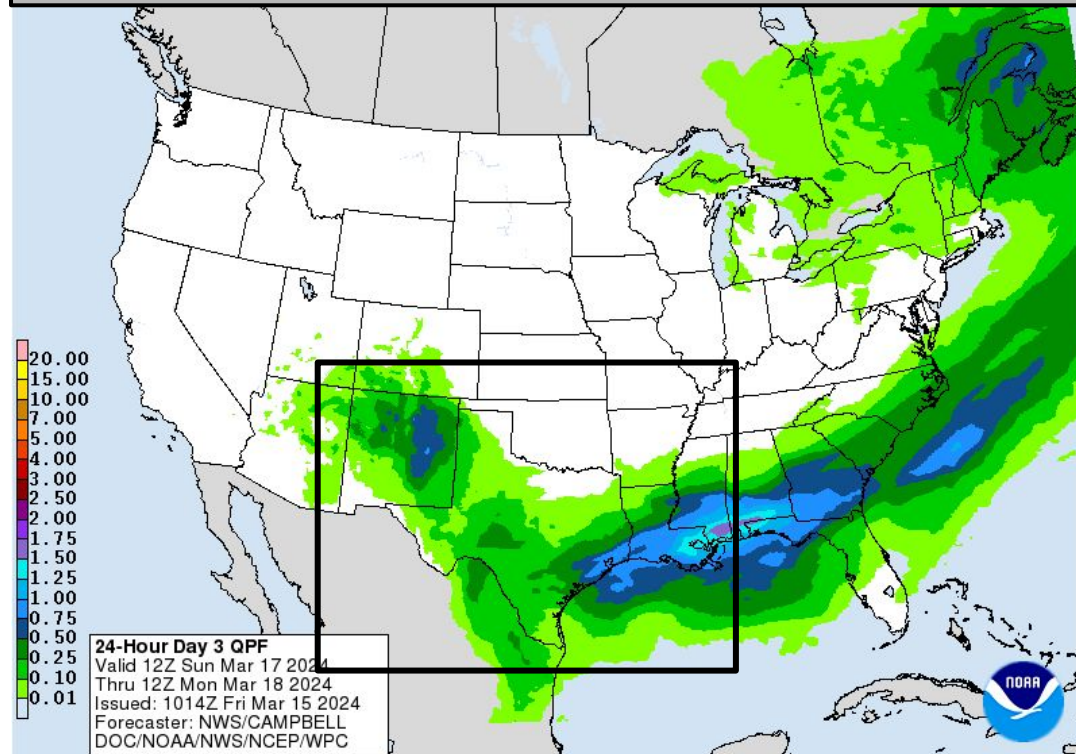

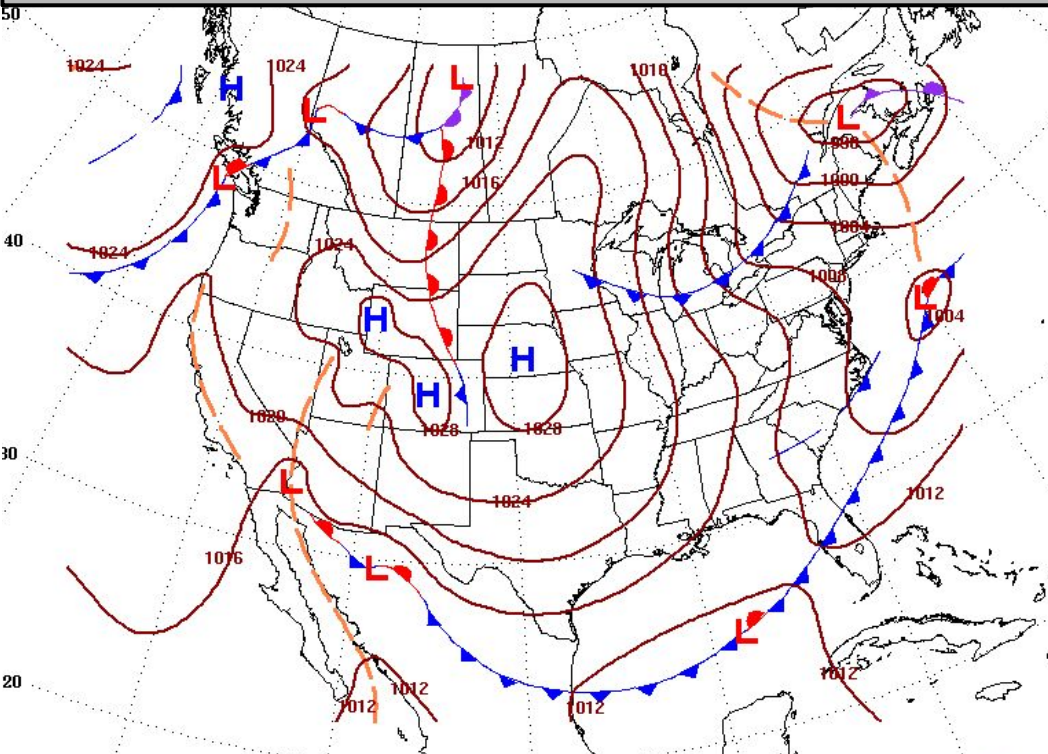
Excessive Rainfall Outlook



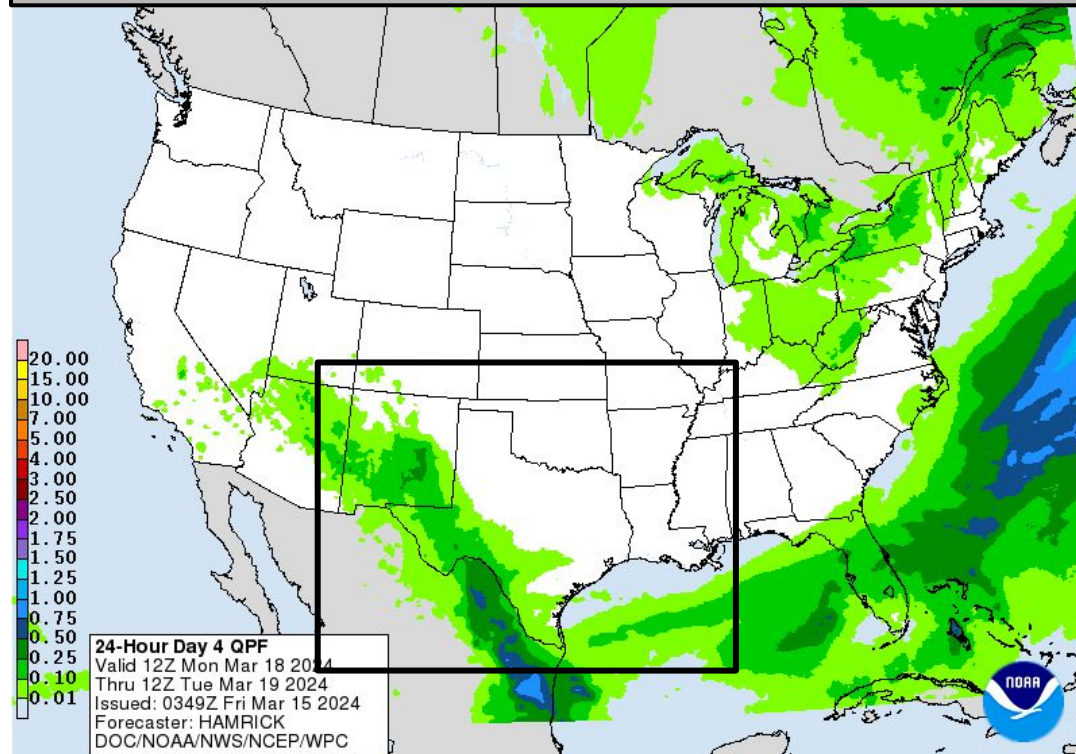
