





March 15, 2024 4:30 AM

Marginal risk for severe thunderstorms on Friday into Friday night.

Key Messages:

- → A few of the more robust thunderstorms could produce severe hazard Friday into Friday night.
- → Large hail up to the size of half dollars.
- → Damaging wind gusts up to 65 mph.
- > Frequent cloud to ground lightning.

Actions

Keep weather aware and stay tuned for later updates.

ISOLATED STRONG TO SEVERE STORMS POSSIBLE TODAY


- Multiple rounds of thunderstorms will develop today. A few storms may become strong to severe, especially in the late afternoon/evening.
- Greatest chance for stronger storms will be west of the I-610 Loop.

- The Severe Weather Threat persists throughout the entire day, but will be greatest during the late afternoon/evening hours










Showers and thunderstorms are expected to develop Friday afternoon. Some storms to the west and northwest of Harris County can become strong to severe. Be weather alert and have ways to receive warnings.




There is a slight risk for severe thunderstorms this evening and tonight in the northern Rio Grande Plains and Brush Country. The primary threat will be large hail.



Our heavy rainfall threat will increase through the weekend. There is a Slight Risk of Excessive Rainfall for much of the area through Saturday. Rainfall amounts will range from 1 to 3" with isolated higher amounts possible.



A Severe Thunderstorm Watch has been issued through noon today for much of the Edwards Plateau. The main threats are the potential for large hail up to tennis ball size and damaging wind gusts to 70 mph, though a tornado or two will be possible as well. Be sure to remain weather aware today and monitor for potential warnings that may be issued.



Multiple rounds of showers and storms are expected today and tonight. There is a level 1-2 out of 5 risk for scattered severe storms Friday. An initial round of scattered storms is possible 5-10 AM Friday with only a low chance for severe weather. A second round of scattered storms is possible 2-10 PM along a cold front. Large to very large hail and damaging wind gusts are the main severe threats, along with pockets of locally heavy rainfall. Overnight, any lingering storm potential will be mainly over our western and southern counties.



Severe Thunderstorm #52






