## Summary of the Upcoming Week

- Marginal to slight risk of severe storms and heavy rain/flash flooding from STX into LA through the weekend.
- Heavy snow / difficult travel for the mountains in N NM through Sunday.
- Minor river flooding continues in ETX and NW/SE LA. Additional minor flooding possible in E/Ctrl TX, mid-upper TX coast, and LA.


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## 5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status

Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall










## Today's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities




## Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities
