A cold front will move south through the area later this morning and afternoon. Temperatures will hover in the 50s this morning with patchy fog ahead of the front, mainly south of I-20. Scattered storms, some strong with gusty winds and hail will continue across primarily eastern Central Texas. A few sprinkles are expected further north. Near seasonal temperatures in the 60s with brisk northerly winds 10 to 20 mph occur behind the cold front for this afternoon.



Numerous Thunderstorms, mainly during the morning. Some storms could become strong to severe, mainly in areas along and south of the I-10 corridor.






