
Wind Speeds

Gusts






Showers and isolated thunderstorms are possible today along with a low-end chance for a severe thunderstorm. Primary severe weather threat appears to be wind gusts up to 60 mph and hail up to quarter size cannot be ruled out.



The chance for rain showers and thunderstorms will return this evening with the passage of an upper-level disturbance. A few marginally severe thunderstorms will be possible. Locally strong wind gusts and marginally severe hail will be the primary hazards associated with any thunderstorm that develops.




Rain chances with embedded thunder will increase from west to east late Wednesday night and continue across the region through Thursday night. A few strong to marginally severe storms will be possible, especially along and south of I-20 with hail and downburst thunderstorm winds. Locally heavy rainfall is expected through the period as well, primarily east of I-35 where total amounts will range between 0.85" to 2+ inches with isolated higher amounts with localized minor flooding possible. Rainfall totals west of I-35 will average between 0.5" to 1"+.



Isolated strong to severe storms may be possible late Wednesday evening into the overnight period. A level 1 out of 5 risk of severe weather is in effect for southeastern areas of South-Central Texas during this time-period. Large hail would be the main risk.




The Storms Prediction Center has placed South Texas in a Marginal Risk of severe thunderstorms for tonight into early Thursday morning. The chance of thunderstorms increases tonight in response to an upper-level disturbance. A few storms may become strong to severe. The primary threats are large hail and damaging winds.



High temperatures this afternoon and Thursday climb into the 70s across most of the area, near normal for this time of year. A low chance (10-25%) of rain is in the forecast for eastern portions of the area as isolated thunderstorms are expected each afternoon.

Fire Danger Forecast




