




A few strong to marginally severe storms are possible this afternoon and early evening across north Texas, mainly in areas south of Wichita Falls. Hail to the size of quarters will be the primary threat.



A rainy and stormy day is expected today. Expect rain showers this morning with thunderstorms developing in the afternoon/evening. A few storms may become strong to marginally severe and be capable of producing hail and austv winds. Thunderstorms will move east during the overnight and exit into East Texas by Friday morning. Locally heavy rainfall will be possible at times under the stronger storms. On average, 0.75" to 1.5" is along/east of I-35 through Friday expected with locally higher amounts. morning amounts are expected west of I-35.




A slow-moving, low-pressure system will bring pockets of heavy rain and embedded thunderstorms to the Four State region, mainly Thursday afternoon through early Friday. Isolated rainfall totals of over 2 inches are more likely across portions of East and Deep East TX, where there will be a Marginal Risk of Flash Flooding.

Scattered to numerous thunderstorms are expected to redevelop this afternoon and evening. A few of these storms may become strong or approach severe levels, with large hail the main concern.



Cloudy skies and cooler temperatures can be expected on Wednesday. Showers will be possible late, mainly after sunset.




