




Wind Speeds

Critical fire weather conditions are expected today across the Oklahoma and Texas Panhandles. Southwesterly winds are expected to gust upwards of 65 mph with relative humidity values getting as low as 15%.




A Red Flag Warning is in effect from 11 AM to 10 PM today for portions of the South Plains and far southern TX Panhandle in association with southwest wind gusts up to 70 mph and relative humidities near 15%. Any fires that develop can spread rapidly. Outdoor burning is discouraged. A Fire Danger Statement is in effect for the same time elsewhere.




Critical fire weather conditions are expected across far western Oklahoma and adjacent north Texas this afternoon.



There is a low chance for tornados on Sunday across portions of northern through west-central and southwest Oklahoma to very low chances across much of the rest of Oklahoma and a small portion of western north Texas. The timing would be during the afternoon into the evening hours.




Rain and storm chances return to North and Central Texas tonight. There is a window for strong to severe storms this evening as storms push into western North and Central Texas. The overall severe threat is low and near zero for locations east of I-35. The storms will move into East Texas Monday morning. There is a 10% chance of isolated storms Monday afternoon across North Texas.




There is a Slight Risk for severe thunderstorms across Louisiana, much of Southern Arkansas, and extreme Northeast Texas during the day Monday through Monday Evening. The greatest threats will be damaging winds, followed by isolated tornadoes and large hail. Excessive heavy rainfall will also be a threat across portions of the Four State Region.




Scattered to numerous storms are expected to develop Sunday evening into early Monday morning, with a few of the storms perhaps approaching severe levels. Large hail and damaging winds will be the main concerns.


San Angelo, TX



There is a level 1 out of 5 risk for strong to severe thunderstorms late this evening into Monday morning for the Edwards Plateau and portions of the Hill Country as a cold front moves across South Central Texas. Large hail, damaging winds, and lightning would be the main threats.



A Red Flag Warning is in effect Sunday afternoon and evening for West Texas and Southeast New Mexico.




Here is a graphical look at all the significant weather areas across the Southwest and Southern Plains. Mountain snow, lowland rain. Very strong winds with some blowing dust, and some elevated and critical fire weather conditions. A strong cold front will move from the Arizona state line, through El Paso overnight and early tomorrow, bringing much cooler temperatures.




Fire Danger Forecast

Keetch-Byram Drought Index


