




Winter weather impacts are expected early on today across the northwestern combined Panhandles. The north central and northwest have the higher potential for these winter weather impacts which include near blizzard conditions due to falling and blowing snow as winds continue to gust out of the north behind a cold front.



Despite the cloud cover tonight temperatures will drop back below freezing for most locations on the Caprock. So don't forget to turn off those sprinklers tonight unless you want an ice rink in the morning!




Confidence is increasing regarding the chances for severe weather today. Damaging winds, tornadoes, large hail, and locally heavy rainfall will be possible. The greatest risk should be over the Ark-La-Miss this afternoon and evening.



Scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms this morning, possibly lingering into early afternoon for our eastern counties. Gusty winds possible in isolated thunderstorms. Hazardous winds and seas expected offshore.




There is a risk for severe thunderstorms this today across southeast Texas and much of Louisiana. There is a chance for multiple hazards, including large hail, damaging wind gusts, tornadoes, and frequent cloud to ground lightning.



Breezy with elevated to near critical fire weather conditions will be in place today.



A Red Flag Warning is in effect for Critical Fire Weather conditions across western areas of South-Central Texas. A Fire Danger Statement is in effect for Elevated to near Critical Fire Weather conditions for central areas of South-Central Texas. These are in effect from Noon through 8 PM today. Gusty westerly winds and very low humidity are expected.



Critical fire weather conditions are expected over portions of the Brush Country this afternoon. A Red Flag Warning is now in effect for La Salle and Webb Counties from noon to 8 PM due to the combination of strong winds and low RH values as a dryline/boundary moves through the area.




Near critical fire weather.






Burn Ban

Keetch-Byram Drought Index


