
Weather Forecast






Showers and thunderstorms are expected today across the Panhandles this afternoon through this evening. Some of the thunderstorms may become severe with the primary hazards being wind gusts up to 70 mph and hail up to the size of guarters.




Critical fire weather conditions are likely this afternoon and evening for the southwest South Plains. Southwesterly winds of 25 to 35 mph with gusts to 50 mph and low relative humidity will be favorable for wildfire spread. A Red Flag Warning is in effect today from 1 PM until 8 PM.







Scattered severe thunderstorms are expected late this afternoon and evening. This threat will be greatest near and north of I-20, but isolated severe storms could develop anywhere in North and Central Texas. Initial storms in western North Texas late this afternoon could be capable of very large hail and have slightly increased potential for tornadoes. Large hail and damaging winds will be the main threats.



The chance for strong to severe storms remains across portions of the Four State Region tonight. Be sure to stay tuned to the forecast for changes and updates.





There is 2 chance some for showers and thunderstorms to develop over the southern Edwards Plateau late this afternoon. This activity is then expected to move eastward into the Hill Country and I-35 corridor this evening, then into the coastal plains after Midnight. There is a chance a few storms could become strong to severe with large hail and damaging wind gusts the main hazards. In addition, a tornado can't be ruled out. As always, stay weather aware and have a way to receive warning information.




A Red Flag Warning is in effect from late this morning through early evening for Southeast New Mexico and most of West Texas. Do not use outdoor flames in these areas, as they could quickly become uncontrolled. Properly field strip cigarettes.






