# Summary of the Upcoming Week

- Elevated to critical fire weather conditions across NM, WTX, WOK, and TX/OK Panhandles through Tuesday.
- Slight risk of severe storms and/or heavy rain/flash flooding from late Monday afternoon through Wednesday across N/Ctrl/ETX, S OK, S AR, and N/W LA.
- Increasing clouds are forecast along the eclipse path across Texas, southeast Oklahoma, and southern Arkansas on Monday.
- Isolated minor river flooding continues in ETX and LA with renewed flooding possible mid to late this week.



Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




Isolated minor river flooding continues in ETX and LA.




Elevated to critical fire weather conditions for E NM, W/NW TX, W OK, and TX/OK Panhandles.

Marginal risk of isolated strong to severe storms for ETX, EAR, N LA.




















