
Thunderstorms will be possible tonight across much of the Panhandles. The far southeast Texas Panhandle may have a severe storm during the evening hours.




Severe weather will be possible late Monday afternoon through the evening hours with greatest chances off the caprock.



Severe thunderstorms are possible from late Monday afternoon through very early Tuesday morning. The primary risk is very large hail up to the size of baseballs. The largest hail will be most likely across western north Texas and far southern Oklahoma. Damaging wind gusts and a low tornado risk also exist.



Severe thunderstorm chances return this afternoon, AFTER the eclipse. There may only be a short window (2-3 hours) between the eclipse and strong to severe storms for some areas. Make your safety plan NOW and have multiple ways to receive warnings! The primary threat is large hail, but tornadoes, damaging winds, and flooding are all possible. The severe weather threat will continue into the overnight hours for much of the area.



There's a risk for severe thunderstorms across most of the Four State Area late this afternoon and into early Tuesday, and again during the day Tuesday and into early Wednesday. Very large hail (greater than 2 inches in diameter), damaging winds, and tornadoes will be possible.

Today and Tonight: Slight Risk of Severe Storms

What?

 A slight risk of some strong to severe storms this afternoon across northern parts of the region.

 Though with considerably lower confidence than this afternoon, we will need to monitor southern parts of the area overnight should another complex of storms develop.

When?

- 2-8pm for northern parts of the region. (moderatehigh confidence).
- Overnight 1am-7am for southern parts (much less confident).

Hazards/Impacts?

Large hail.

Secondary:

 Damaging winds, isolated tornadoes and locally heavy downpours.

Actions

 Monitor the forecast and have multiple ways to receive warnings if they are issued.












A slight risk of severe storms today and tonight




There is a marginal risk for a strong to severe storm this evening up across east central Texas and west central Louisiana.





Mostly cloudy conditions are expected today with the chance for some showers or a few storms late this morning. Some strong to severe storms will be possible beginning in the mid-afternoon through around 8 PM, mainly in northeast Hill Country and near to northeast of the Austin metro. Make sure to have a way to receive weather information as chances for severe storms continues tonight into Tuesday.



There is a Marginal to Slight Risk for Severe Thunderstorms across portions of South Texas Today, mainly from this evening into tonight. Large hail, damaging winds and an isolated tornado are possible. Check to ensure your severe weather safety plans are in order and be prepared to seek shelter if a warning is issued for your area.




Elevated fire weather conditions are expected today from southeastern New Mexico to the Big Bend in West Texas. Relative humidities will drop to as low as 5 percent this afternoon and combined with dry fuels may allow for rapid ignition of wildfires.



Fire Danger Forecast



Keetch-Byram Drought Index


