


Weather Forecast

Confidence is increasing regarding the potential for thunderstorms to develop along the drvline Thursday afternoon. These thunderstorms would become super cellular with the potential for all hazards, including very large hail, continuing into a portion of Thursday evening. There are still some uncertainties, such as the exact position of the dryline among others. Stay tuned for updates.




The severe weather risk is marginal (level 1 of 5), but could come in two rounds. The first will continue through early this afternoon, and the second round from around 7 PM overnight through sunrise Thursday morning.





A low chance of severe thunderstorms (10-40%) is expected this afternoon and evening across the central and eastern Permian Basin. The overall chance of thunderstorms remains low but any thunderstorms that do develop could quickly become severe. The main hazards will be large hail and damaging winds with these thunderstorms, though an isolated tornado can not be ruled out. Have multiple ways to receive warnings today!



Isolated severe thunderstorms may develop this afternoon across the far southeast Texas Panhandle, eastern South Plains and Rolling Plains. Very large hail and damaging wind gusts are the main threats. Although unlikely, a tornado or two cannot be ruled out.







Keetch-Byram Drought Index


