Two rounds of storms are expected today. Storms will be most expansive this morning into the early afternoon along and east of I- 35. Isolated strong to marginally severe storms and flooding will be possible with the morning activity. Isolated storms are possible late this afternoon near a dryline. There is a conditional severe threat with the late afternoon activity.



A Slight Risk for severe thunderstorms is in place today through this evening for Northeast Texas, Southeast Oklahoma, and Southwest Arkansas. Isolated to scattered strong to severe storms will be possible over these areas, with damaging winds, large hail, and an isolated tornado or two possible.



Isolated to scattered showers and storms are possible today north of I-10.



A Slight Risk for severe thunderstorms is in place today through this evening for Northeast Texas, Southeast Oklahoma, and Southwest Arkansas. Isolated to scattered strong to severe storms will be possible over these areas, with damaging winds, large hail, and an isolated tornado or two possible.



Mostly cloudy and warm. Isolated to scattered storms will be possible If any storms do develop some storms could be strong. Otherwise, highs will be in the 80s to middle 90s with the warmer values near the Rio Grande.




Elevated Fire weather out west today.



Fire Danger Forecast




Burn Ban

Keetch-Byram Drought Index


