



A Flood Watch remains in effect for locations near and east of the I-35 corridor through 1pm this afternoon. Possible Impacts: Flooding may occur in low-lying, urban, and poor drainage areas. Rapid rises will be possible on creeks, streams, and rivers. Actions to Take: Those living in areas prone to flooding should be prepared to take action should flooding develop. Rainfall Amounts: Additional rainfall amounts of up to 1 inch possible through late morning.



Showers and thunderstorms will become widespread across much of the region this morning, becoming more scattered in coverage during the afternoon.


Lake Charles, LA



Additional rainfall today will likely bring more flooding to southeast Texas as 1 to 3 inches will be possible, with locally higher amounts up to 6 inches.




A moderate risk has been outlined across southeast Texas for excessive rainfall potential.




A Flood Watch remains in effect through Sunday evening. Do not drive across flooded roads!



Very warm temperatures and partly sunny skies will occur today. Isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms, mainly north across the ranchlands. Meanwhile, along the Lower Texas Coast, mariners can expect moderate winds and seas with Small Craft Should Exercise Caution conditions on the Laguna Madre and the offshore Gulf waters.



Scattered showers and thunderstorms are possible across the area today. A few storms could be strong to severe. High temperatures will be mainly in the 80s, but near 90 in the Rio Grande Plains.



Early morning storms on Sunday will move east of the area. After a brief break, scattered afternoon showers and storms are forecast to re-develop. Isolated storms could become severe, producing large hail and damaging wind gusts. There is a Level 2 out of 5 risk for severe storms through portions of the southern Hill Country, southern I-35 corridor, Rio Grande, and Coastal Plains.





Fire Danger Forecast




Burn Ban

Keetch-Byram Drought Index


