




Another round of scattered storms are expected to develop near and along a stationary boundary this afternoon and evening. Many will likely remain dry, but if storms develop they will likely become strong to severe. The primary threats are very large hail and damaging wind gusts. We will also need to monitor the potential for excessive rainfall and localized flash flooding since the bulk of this rain is expected to fall over already water-logged areas.



There will be another chance for severe weather this afternoon through the late evening hours across much of the Four State Region. Widespread damaging wind gusts will be the main threat with winds as high as 70-75 mph along with large hail and an isolated tornado threat. Look for excessive, heavy rainfall to accompany these storms as well.




Lake Charles, LA

Large to very large hail is possible on Thursday afternoon and evening as a cold front moves in from the north. Damaging winds are also possible along with a tornado or two.




Severe storms are expected this afternoon and early evening over the northern half of the region. Large hail and damaging winds are the primary hazards.





Fire Danger Forecast



Keetch-Byram Drought Index


