




Wind Speeds







While this moring will be off to a dry start, increasing clouds as well as showers and storms will begin moveing into the area later in teh day. Widespreda showers and thudnerstorms are expected on Sunday, with threats for hail and heavy rainfall. Locations south of I-20 have the highest potential to experience additional flooding on Sunday. Strong to severe thunderstorms are possible this evening and overnight, generally across the Brush Country, as storms across the mountainous terrain of Mexico move across the Rio Grande. Main threats are large hail and damaging winds. Stay weather aware tonight!



While low level moisture will temporarily return in the early morning, a dryline with southwest to west winds of 5 to 15 will push east across West Central Texas. Relative humidity values will fall to minimums of 20 percent or less, with 10 to 12 percent in the Concho Valley south to Ozona and Sonora.



There is a low risk for severe thunderstorms today across much of the area. Large hail and strong winds will be the main threats. Far eastern portions of our area have been included in a marginal risk (level 1/5) for severe weather Saturday afternoon. Main risks with thunderstorms will be damaging outflow winds and hail.

Isolated-to-scattered thunderstorms are expected to develop across the portions of our area today.

Locally heavy rainfall is possible where the storms occur. This will bring the potential for localized flooding and ponding on roads, particularly for low-lying areas.

Severe weather is not expected otherwise .




