Summary of the Upcoming Week

- Moderate Risk for heavy rain/flash flooding for E/SETX, LA on Thursday,
 Slight Risk for LA on Friday.
- Slight risk for severe storms across TX Thursday, moving into LA on Friday.
- Elevated fire weather Wednesday for S NM, far W TX
- Moderate to isolated major river flooding continues across E/SETX, with minor river flooding across LA.



5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status


Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




Marginal risk of severe storms NW TX/Panhandle











Marginal risk for severe storms for the OK/TX Panhandles.

Marginal risk for heavy rainfall/flash flooding across much of OK & TX.




Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities











Purple	Extreme Safety: Property Damage Unavoidable, Immediate Action to Save Life will be Needed Impact Potential: Typically Results in Long-Lived Widespread Major Disruption to Daily Life	Severe: High Risk from SPC Flooding: Major flooding expected over a widespread area (including urban locations) Tropical: A Major Hurricane (Cat3 or greater) expected to move towards or near any coastline Fire: Large area of critical conditions for 2 or more days, Warnings for 3 or more days, Long term (months) of severe to extreme drought	 A Category 4 hurricane is headed towards the SE LA; major storm surge, flooding and damaging winds anticipated to begin tomorrow Widespread severe storms expected, tornado outbreak probable with long- lived, very widespread and particularly intense storms
