





Severe thunderstorms are expected today with the greatest risk area along and south of I-20. Large hail and damaging winds will be the main threats with severe thunderstorms, but heavy rain and flooding is the primary concern with prolonged heavy rainfall likely today. Thunderstorms will affect western North Texas shortly after sunrise, and spread into Central Texas early in the afternoon.



Widespread heavy will across much of the region today. Storms will progress from northwest to southeast beginning in western North Texas this morning, moving into Central Texas early in the afternoon. Flash flooding is likely to particularly south of I-20 where the heaviest rain amounts are expected with already saturated grounds from recent rainfall.


An initial upper level disturbance will move across the region through tonight, producing widespread heavy rain with embedded thunderstorms. Some of these storms will have the potential to become severe.


Here are Thursday's expected high temperatures.

- Locally heavy rainfall could result in dangerous flash flooding.
 - High risk (level 4 of 4) exists mainly north thru east of the Huntsville
 - Moderate risk (level 3 of 4) exists mainly near and along a line from College Station to Conroe to Liberty.
 - Slightrisk (level 2 of 4) exists for most of the rest of SE TX, except the Matagorda Bay area where there is a Marginal risk (level 1 of 4).
- Isolated to scattered strong to severe thunderstorms possible.
 - Enhanced risk (level 3 of 5) near and especially north of Interstate 10.
- Slightrisk (level 2 of 5) exists near and south of Interstate 10.
- Marginal risk (level 1 of 5) exists near the immediate coast.



· Periods of showers and storms, mainly Thursday afternoon thru Thursday evening.

IMPACTS



- Localized flash flooding is possible as well as additional rises along area rivers and creeks, especially where already saturated.
- . Large hail and damaging wind gusts are the primary concerns. A brief, isolated tornado or two cannot be ruled out.




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

- Strongest storms are expected over Sierra and Otero Counties






