
Critical fire weather is expected for much of the western half of the combined Panhandles today. Sustained winds between 20 to 30 mph with gusts up to 45 mph are expected as well as RH values between 5 to 10%.



Although not likely, a storm or two may develop across the far eastern Panhandles this afternoon and evening, if the dry line hangs far enough west. Any storms that do develop could quickly become severe with large hail and damaging winds the primary threats before moving into western OK.



A Red Flag Warning is in effect from noon Saturday through midnight Sunday for most areas on the Caprock, while a Rangeland Fire Danger statement is in effect for the far eastern South Plains/far western Rolling Plains. Hot, dry, and breezy conditions may lead to critical fire weather conditions across the Caprock and the far southwestern and central Texas Panhandle.



Slight chance for thunderstorms to develop this afternoon and evening across the eastern Rolling Plains. Large hail up to golfball size and damaging wind gusts up to 60 mph will be the main threats with any storm that does develop.



Severe storms are expected on Saturday afternoon into evening. All severe storm hazards are expected.




Isolated to scattered severe thunderstorms may develop across portions of western North Texas later this afternoon and evening impacting locations primarily along/north of I-20 and west of Hwy 75. All modes of severe weather will be possible with these supercells thunderstorms if they develop in our area. Many locations will remain dry! Have multiple ways to receive warning this evening if you are in the threat area!




Dangerous heat continues continues today. A Heat Advisory remains in effect for all of Deep South Texas, except the barrier islands, till 11 AM this morning, but will remain in effect for coastal portions of Cameron, Kenedy and Willacy counties till 7 PM this evening. An Excessive Heat Warning goes into effect for all inland portions of Deep South Texas from 11 AM this morning till 7 PM this evening.




A Coastal Flood Advisory is in effect until 2 PM Saturday for the islands from Port Aransas to Baffin Bay. Minor coastal flooding during time of high tide may lead to flooding of beach access roads as water approaches the dunes.




Dangerous heat will continue through Saturday night. Therefore, most of South Texas will remain in an Excessive Heat Warning or a Heat Advisory through Saturday night. A major to extreme risk of heat-related impacts will continue through the holiday weekend.



A High Wind Warning is in effect from late this morning through this evening for the Guadalupe and Delaware Mountains. A Wind Advisory is in effect from late this morning through this evening for the Eddy and Culberson County Plains, as well as central and northern Lea County.





### Fire Danger Forecast




#### Burn Ban

#### **Keetch-Byram Drought Index**


