




Another day of strong to severe thunderstorms is expected today for the Texas/Oklahoma Panhandles. The primary hazards will be large hail and damaging wind gusts, but tornados cannot be ruled out. Additionally, storms could produce heavy rainfall that could lead to flash flooding.




Severe thunderstorms may start forming or moving into the western and northern Panhandles by 4 to 5 PM. Storms are forecast to move east and southeast throughout the evening and the severe threat should end by late evening tonight.




It will be another very warm day on Thursday with high temperatures running a few degrees above average. Our winds will be from the southwest at 10 to 15 mph under mostly sunny skies.




Another round of showers and storms is expected tonight (Thursday night), with the map indicating the most likely timing. Some storms may be severe and may also contain heavy rain.



A cluster or complex of showers and thunderstorms, some severe by this afternoon and again tonight will also contain locally heavy rainfall. The first round today will arrive from the northwest and mainly impact North Texas later this morning into the afternoon hours. A brief reprieve occurs this evening before another complex of strong to severe storms arrives from the west late tonight. Some heavy rainfall and areas of flooding can also be expected.




A mesoscale convective system will move across the Red River region and bring a chance for thunderstorms across the region. A few strong to severe thunderstorms are possible.




For today, partly cloudy skies with afternoon showers and thunderstorms possible.



Another warm and muggy night is expected with mostly cloudy skies. There is a chance for a line of strong to severe thunderstorms that may move through the region from NW to SE between midnight tonight and sunrise Friday.



Warm with highs in the upper 80s to low 90s. Thunderstorm chances return this afternoon and evening.






There is a medium (40-70%) chance of storms becoming severe across the east-central Permian Basin this and lower Trans Pecos afternoon/evening. Large hail and damaging winds are the main risks, but an isolated tornado cannot be ruled out. Make sure you stay weather aware today and ensure you can receive warnings!







Another round of strong to severe storms and locally heavy rainfall will be possible on Thursday into Friday. Only isolated storms are expected for the weekend as temperatures remain near to slightly above normal. Warmer temperatures are expected Monday and heat indices will be on the increase.




Strong to severe thunderstorms will be possible on Friday.




Fire Danger Forecast



Burn Ban




Keetch-Byram Drought Index
