


A few storms could generate in our eastern counties later this afternoon and evening. Storms could quickly become severe if they can overcome the capping inversion. Very large hail, damaging winds, and a tornado or two are all possible.




An isolated thunderstorm or two is possible this afternoon and evening east of the dryline across the far southeast Texas Panhandle and eastern Rolling Plains.





Scattered showers and thunderstorms will be possible once again through Monday afternoon as leftover boundaries trigger additional development. Some of these storms could be severe, mainly for large hail and damaging winds.




A Slight Risk for severe thunderstorms is highlighted across our entire Four-State region today, mainly for this afternoon into the evening and overnight hours with multiple rounds of storms possible. Damaging wind gusts are expected to be the primary threat, while an isolated tornado and large hail are secondary threats. Additionally, localized heavy rainfall may contribute to flash flooding, especially in poor drainage and flood prone areas.




Storms organizing across Kansas and Oklahoma early this morning will move southeast into the region later today. Some storms could pose a risk of damaging wind gusts, with a lesser risk of large hail or isolated tornadoes, mainly from the Lakes region of southeast Texas into central Louisiana.




Muggy conditions with another chance of scattered showers and thunderstorms. Isolated stronger thunderstorms capable of strong winds and hail are possible.



A Heat Advisory is in effect from 1 PM today until 7 PM this evening for portions of deep South Texas and the Rio Grande Valley.




A Heat Advisory will be in effect from 1 PM this afternoon through 7 PM this evening. Heat indices will range from 110-114 degrees. Make sure you stay cool and hydrated.




A Heat Advisory is in effect for southwestern parts of our area from 1 PM this afternoon to 7 PM this evening. Heat index values up to 112 can be expected. Elsewhere, heat index values up to 108 can be expected across much of the I-35 corridor, Coastal Plains, and Val Verde County.



There is a marginal to slight risk of severe weather this afternoon and evening, mainly east of the dryline. The main severe weather hazards will be damaging winds and large hail. An isolated tornado cannot be ruled out especially across portions of the Big Country. In addition, very large hail (2 inches or larger) is possible across portions of Haskell and Throckmorton counties.



A Heat Advisory is in effect this afternoon for Terrell and lower Brewster counties. Temperatures will range from the upper 90s to low 110s along the Rio Grande. Stay hydrated if outdoors today and avoid long exposure to heat.



A heat advisory has been issued for portions of El Paso, Dona Ana, and Hudspeth counties for Wednesday and Thursday. REMEMBER: Drink plenty of fluids, stay in the AC, check up on relatives/neighbors, don't leave pets or children unattended in vehicles!!






