# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Tuesday, June 04, 2024

#### Summary of the Upcoming Week

- Moderate risk of excessive rainfall across SE OK, SW AR, NETX, NW LA today.
   Thunderstorms will move across these areas this morning and again later tonight, increasing the risk for flash flooding. Flash flood risk returns to NE OK, NW AR this weekend.
- Slight risk of severe storms for S OK, S AR, N/NETX, N LA today.
- Elevated fire weather conditions across S NM, Far W TX through Wednesday.
- Heat spreads across S/SETX and S LA this week.
- Minor to moderate flooding continues across ETX, LA and AR.

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






#### 5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status

Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall







#### Thunderstorm Outlook Timing




- Thunderstorms may produce gusty winds this morning and afternoon in East Texas/Louisiana (see Alexandria timing graphic)








#### Tomorrow's Tornado & Severe Wind / Hail Probabilities




