





Much cooler temperatures today will be met with on/off showers and thunderstorms. Locally heavy rain with additional flooding is possible in addition to a few severe storms.



Additional storms remain possible tonight under mostly cloudy skies. Lows will be in the 60s with light winds.



Scattered showers and storms are expected today and Tuesday. The clouds and rain potential will keep temperatures slightly cooler with highs in the 80s. A few strong storms are possible, but the severe threat remains low.




Not quite as hot today across the Rio Grande Plains and Brush Country where highs will generally be in the upper 90s to near 100. Low to mid 90s can be expected across the remainder of South Texas. Heat indices (apparent temperature) between 100-109° can be expected. Please continue to practice heat safety. There is a 20 to 30 percent chance of showers and thunderstorms. Winds will be southeast 10 to 15 mph.

Shelter vehicles and property from hail damage if possible



There is a low (10-40%) potential for severe thunderstorms this afternoon and evening across most locations to the east of the higher terrain. Storms are expected to develop around 2PM CDT and move eastward, continuing through around midnight. The window for most likely severe will be from 5 to 10 PM CDT. Ensure weather alerts on your smart devices are turned on, and have multiple ways to receive warnings. Secure loose objects that could be damaged by strong winds, and shelter vehicles from potential hail damage if possible.



Monday: A backdoor cold front will bring a chance for showers and thunderstorms to the mountains and areas mainly east of the Rio Grande. The winds will be light to low end breezy and variable with the skies partly cloudy. With the passage of this front, the temperatures will be at and below the normal for this time of the year.




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




