



Flood Watch is in effect for areas of southeast Thursday morning. Rainfall through Texas amounts ranging from 2 to 6 inches are possible, with pockets of locally higher amounts.



#### A Flood Watch is in effect



Hazardous marine conditions are expected this week as elevated winds, seas, tides, and rip current risks develop as a result of a potential tropical system in the Bay of Campeche.



A Tropical Storm Warning is in effect for coastal counties and over the waters of the Middle Texas Coast. Gusty winds are expected today through early Thursday with widespread heavy rain, coastal flooding and a high risk of rip currents.



A Flood Watch is in effect for all of South Texas from this evening through Thursday. Widespread heavy rain is expected with rainfall totals of 4 to 9 inches.



Due to potential flooding caused by excessive rainfall, a Flood Watch goes into effect at 1 AM (CDT) Wednesday, or late Tuesday night, till 1 PM (CDT) Thursday afternoon for all of Deep South Texas. Motorists are urged to be cautious of, especially at night, and avoid flooded roadways. Turn around and find an alternate route.



A Tropical Storm Warning is in effect for Coastal and Inland portions of Kenedy, Willacy, and Cameron Counties, as well as the Laguna Madre and Lower Texas Coastal Gulf Waters.




Tide levels will continue to increase today through Wednesday. Coastal flooding is expected with water to the dunes and over numerous roads along the coast and bays. Additionally, there is a high risk for dangerous rip currents along gulf facing beaches.



A Coastal Flood Warning in effect at 1 AM Wednesday, or late Tuesday night, till 1 PM Thursday afternoon for Coastal Kenedy, Coastal Willacy, Coastal Cameron Counties and the barrier islands. Water levels are expected to rise sharply Tuesday night with tides potentially rising 2 to 3 feet above ground level, leading to possible inundation of low lying property and, or roads.



A marginal risk of severe storms will exist across the southwestern Texas Panhandle today. Storms will be capable of producing wind gusts to 65 mph along with quarter size hail.



A Flood Watch has been issued for areas along and south of I-10 and east of I-35 from Wednesday morning through Thursday afternoon. This location has the highest potential to see impacts from flooding which include flooding of small creeks and streams and also flooding in low lying locations including urban areas. Remember, never drive around barricades! Stay weather aware this week.






#### OUTDOOR BURN BANS


