# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Wednesday, June 19, 2024

## Summary of the Upcoming Week

- Heavy rainfall/flash flooding likely in S/SETX spreading to SWTX Thursday.
   Flash flooding over the burn scar areas of NMThu/Fri.
- Moderate with isolated Major river flooding in ETX.
- PTC One in the Bay of Campeche is expected to make landfall in northern Mexico. Heavy rain, coastal flooding, rip currents across the Gulf Coast from S TX into LA.
- A broad area of low pressure is expected to develop in the SW Gulf of Mexico this weekend. Gradual strengthening possible early next week as the system moves N/NW. Low chance of development (30%) in the next 7 days.






Tropical storm warning along the S TX coast, moderate coastal flooding, heavy rainfall/flash flooding associated with PTC One.





#### 5-Day Precipitation Forecast & River Flood Status


Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall

Moderate risk for heavy rainfall/flash flooding in STX.















#### Tomorrow's Weather



Slight risk for heavy rainfall/flash flooding in SW TX and over the burn scar areas of NM.




## Friday's Weather



Heavy rainfall may lead to flash flooding in NM and STX.




## Saturday's Weather



Isolated heavy rainfall may lead to flash flooding in STX.




## Sunday's Weather
