

Copious amounts of rain have already fallen over parts of the northern Panhandles overnight, leading to several areas of flash flooding. If additional showers and storms can form today, more flash flooding will be possible.


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
Storms are possible yet again this afternoon and evening for portions of the Panhandles. However, lingering storms into the overnight morning hours may prevent the ability for new storms to develop later this afternoon and evening. If they can form, hail and wind would be the main threats.



Coastal flood advisory and high risk of rip currents expected through Thursday morning.




A Flood Watch remains in effect for southwestern portions of Southeast Texas through early Thursday morning.



Wet and stormy conditions can be expected from tonight through the end of the week as a tropical disturbance moves across the region. Average rainfall amounts of 8-10 inches are likely across the southern Coastal Bend with 4-8 inches across the rest of South Texas. Locally higher amounts up to 15 inches will be possible. These heavy rains will likely lead to flash flooding, especially across the Coastal Bend.



A Tropical Storm Warning is in effect for of Kenedy, Willacy, and Cameron Counties, as well as the Laguna Madre and Lower Texas Coastal Gulf Waters.




A Coastal Flood Warning in effect until 1 PM Thursday afternoon for Coastal Kenedy, Coastal Willacy, Coastal Cameron Counties and the barrier islands. Water levels are expected to rise sharply Tuesday night with tides potentially rising 2 to 3 feet above ground level, leading to possible inundation of low lying property and, or roads.




Due to potential flooding caused by excessive rainfall, a Flood Watch goes into effect until 1 PM Thursday afternoon for all of Deep South Texas. Motorists are urged to be cautious of, especially at night, and avoid flooded roadways. Turn around and find an alternate route.



Heavy rainfall, associated with Potential Tropical Cyclone One, will move into portions of south-central Texas Wednesday through Thursday. The highest chances for heavy rainfall that could lead to flash flooding and river flooding are located where the Flood Watch is in effect. This location has the highest potential to see impacts from flooding which include flooding of small creeks and streams and also flooding in low lying locations including urban areas. Remember, never drive around barricades! Stay weather aware Wednesday through Tursday.



There is also Level 1 of 5 risk of isolated tornadoes during the day on Wednesday. These tropical tornadoes tend to be weaker and more short-lived compared to tornadoes we get in the Spring time. Nevertheless, be prepared to shelter if a tornado warning is issued for your area.




Tonight will be mild and muggy as southeast winds hold moisture in place across the South Plains area. Some thunderstorms are possible with the best chances across the far southwestern Panhandle and the northwestern South Plains. Severe weather looks to be unlikely at this time.




Fire Danger Forecast



Burn Ban




Keetch-Byram Drought Index
