STATEWIDE CURRENT SITUATION: On June 18, Governor Greg Abbott <u>directed</u> the Texas Division of Emergency Management (TDEM) to increase the readiness level of the Texas State Emergency Operations Center to Level II (Escalated Response Conditions) to begin 24-hour operations ahead of tropical weather hazards expected to impact the state.

This tropical system, according to the National Weather Service, is expected to further develop and cause potentially dangerous rainfall and flooding across large areas of the state. The areas of concern include South Texas, Coastal Bend, and Southeast Texas.

On June 17, Governor Abbott <u>directed</u> TDEM to activate state emergency response resources ahead of impacts from tropical weather threats.

OPERATIONAL PRIORITIES:

- 1. Protect life and property.
- 2. Support rapid & effective response.
- 3. Collect and disseminate accurate incident information to improve decisionmaking.
- 4. Accurately track incident costs associated with assigned resources for cost recovery.

Region 5 (Includes DDs 19-21)

DD 20 – Corpus Christi (Includes Aransas, Bee, Brooks, Duval, Jim Wells, Kenedy, Kleberg, Live Oak, Nueces, Refugio, and San Patricio Counties)

On June 18, Disaster District Emergency Operations Center (DDEOC) 20 is at Level II activation (Escalated Response) and will maintain 24-hour staffing in response to the anticipated tropical weather.

DD 21 - Weslaco (Includes Cameron, Hidalgo, and Willacy Counties)

On June 18, DDEOC 21 (Weslaco) is at Level II (Escalated Response) and will maintain 24-hour staffing in response to the anticipated tropical weather.

RESPONDING STATE AGENCIES/ORGANIZATIONS REPORTS

STATE RESOURCES COMMITTED

Communications Coordination Group (CCG): Amateur Radio operators (RACES/ARES) have begun to determine resources and personnel that may be required for the incoming tropical weather.

Texas A&M Engineering Extension Service (TEEX) Texas Task Force 1 (TX-TF1) and Texas Task Force 2 (TX-TF2): On June 17, TX-TF1 activated a Type 3 Water Capable Urban Search and Rescue team, six Type 3 Swift Water Rescue boat squads, and one Water Group Supervisor package with a team of five personnel. On June 18, TX-TF2 activated a Water Capable Type 3 Urban Search and Rescue team. TEEX resources are positioned in TDEM regions 4,5,6 and 8 in anticipation of the incoming tropical weather along the Texas Gulf Coast.

Texas A&M Forest Service (TAMFS): TAMFS continues to monitor the weather and maintains situational awareness for tropical weather threats. TAMFS has activated four All Hazard TIFMAS Strike Teams and has them positioned in San Antonio, Vicotria, Corpus Christi, and Weslaco.

Texas Military Department (TMD): TMD has activated three Ground Transportation Platoons (GTPs), one Ground Transportation Company Headquarters (GTCHQ), Rotary Wing Heavy Mission Ready Package (MRP), and Rotary Wing Medium MRP and the State Operations Center (SOC) Support Team. GTP's are staged in Houston, Angleton, and Victoria, the Rotary Wing Heavy MRP is staged at Grand Prairie, the Rotary Wing Medium MRP is staged at Martindale with two TX TF-1 Rescue Swimmers on each aircraft and the SOC support team is deployed in Austin. TMD has activated a total of 68 personnel, 19 Vehicles and four aircraft in support of the incoming tropical weather.

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD): TPWD is ready to respond to the incoming tropical weather and support rescue and evacuation operations. TPWD has prepared department resources consisting of Texas Game Wardens and State

Parks Police Officers equipped with 4x4 patrol vehicles, swift water boats, shallow water boats, and a rescue helicopter to support boat rescue operations. TPWD currently has representatives at the SOC and DDEOC 20 Corpus Christi.

Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT): TxDOT is staffing the SOC for dayshift and virtually for nightshift and has 25 district crews ready to provide 24-hour support. TxDOT districts began preparing for the tropical weather by cleaning out culverts and inlets, re-grading ditches, and has staged barricades at known flooding locations. TxDOT Aransas Pass and the Galveston Ferry Operations are monitoring tide levels and prepping vessels for the incoming weather.

DriveTexas.org is being updated to ensure motorists have access to current road safety advisories.
