# FEMA Region 6 Weather Threat Briefing

Thursday, June 20, 2024

### Summary of the Upcoming Week

- Heavy rainfall/flash flooding across SW TX today. Flash flooding over the burn scar areas of NM through the weekend.
- Isolated severe storms in NW NM today.
- Moderate river flooding in ETX.
- TS Alberto is nearing landfall in northern Mexico. Heavy rain, coastal flooding, rip currents from STX into LA.
- An area of low pressure developing in the Bay of Campeche this weekend. Gradual strengthening through early next week. Medium chance of development (50%) in the next seven days, and low chance (10%) in next 48 hrs.





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


Coastal flooding continues in TX, LA. Heavy rain leading to flash flooding in S/WTX.

Note: Even though the image displays 5 days of forecasted rainfall, river forecasts only include 1-2 days of rainfall




Moderate river flooding in ETX. **Trinity River at Riverside** expected to drop to minor today. Impacts to roads and agriculture.













#### Tomorrow's Weather



Isolated heavy rainfall/flash flooding in STX and NM.




#### Saturday's Weather



Isolated heavy rainfall/flash flooding in STX.




#### Sunday's Weather


