




COASTAL FLOOD WARNING In Effect Today




Hazardous conditions along the coast today



A Coastal Flood Warning in effect until 7 PM this evening for Coastal Kenedy, Coastal Willacy, Coastal Cameron Counties and the barrier islands. Tides have the potential of rising 1 to 2 feet above ground level, leading to inundation of low lying property and, or roads.




Due to potential flooding caused by excessive rainfall, a Flood Watch goes into effect until 1 PM Thursday afternoon for all of Deep South Texas. Motorists are urged to be cautious of, especially at night, and avoid flooded roadways. Turn around and find an alternate route.

Rainfall will be possible Thursday afternoon and evening. If these storms produce rainfall over recent burn scars in Otero County, rapid runoff will result in flooding of the Rio Ruidoso as well as along US Highway 70.



Scattered showers and some thunderstorms will move to the northwest across the area today with the best chances coming across locations to the south and west of the Lubbock area. Otherwise partly sunny skies and highs from the mid 70s to lower 80s can be expected.






