







Showers and storms possible today along and north of I-40. Main concern will be wind, but can't rule out hail up to the size of quarters.




High temperatures up to 103 degrees combined with dewpoints in the 60s will lead to heat index values up to 107 degrees. Caution should be used if you need to work/play outdoors during peak heating hours this afternoon. A Heat Advisory will be in effect from 1 PM until 8 PM CDT this evening for the far southeastern Texas Panhandle and eastern Rolling Plains.




It will be a hot day again today. Adding the humidity, heat index values will range from 105 to 115! Be prepared for this heat and take precautions.



The Excessive Heat Warning and Heat Advisory continues through this evening. Dangerously hot conditions will increase the risk for heat-related illnesses this afternoon and Saturday afternoon. If you're planning on spending time outdoors, make sure to drink plenty of water and take breaks frequently!




An Excessive Heat Warning is in effect for the entire Four State Region until 8 PM this evening. Dangerously hot conditions with heat index of at least 110 will be possible.



Heat Advisory is in effect once again today with high temperatures in the mid 90s and high humidity bringing about Heat Indices up to 110F this afternoon.



A few showers and thunderstorms will be possible across the area today. Otherwise, expect hot and humid conditions with highs in the 90s and heat indices up to 110°F. Winds will be from the south at 5 to 10 MPH with gusts to 15 MPH.



Another Heat Advisory will go into effect on Saturday for most of Southeast Texas from 12pm-7pm CDT.



A Heat Advisory is in effect from 1 PM to 7 PM Saturday for the Interstate 35 Corridor and Coastal Plains. Those spending time outdoors should stay hydrated with water and take frequent breaks out of the sun to minimize risk of heat related illness.




The Heat Advisory has been extended through tomorrow evening. Expect heat index values up to 108°F.



Fire Danger Forecast




