


Wind Speeds


The potential for strong to severe storms returns to the region on Tuesday across much of the Texas and Oklahoma Panhandles. Current expectation is that storms will be on the low-end side of severe limits, with large hail up to quarters and wind gusts up to 60 mph should any storms become severe.



As we begin a new week, the heat continues throughout North and Central Texas. Widespread triple digit temperatures are expected with even hotter heat index values. Stay hydrated, take frequent breaks if spending time outdoors, and wear light colored clothing!




A Heat Advisory is in effect until 8 PM CDT Tuesday. Heat index values will climb above 105 degrees in most locations.



Scattered thunderstorms are expected again today, especially across portions of Western Louisiana and Deep East Texas.







Fire Danger Forecast




