


Isolated thunderstorms are expected to develop across the region late this afternoon and evening, before dissipating around or shortly after sunset. While severe thunderstorms are not expected, a few storms could produce wind gusts up to 55 mph and very heavy rainfall.



Mostly sunny skies and seasonably hot temperatures are expected today and Friday. A few very isolated thunderstorms may develop across portions of North and Central Texas this afternoon. Scattered storms will be possible again Friday across the Brazos Valley and Central Texas. Most locations will likely remain dry! Lightning and brief, gusty winds will be the main threats.




A Heat Advisory is in effect for all of Southeast Texas.

Isolated to widely scattered showers and thunderstorms are expected mainly over southern areas. A few strong storms could produce locally heavy downpours more than 1 inch and gusty winds. Seasonally warm high temperatures in the 90s can be expected.




Upper flow will turn from north to northeast with perhaps a bit drier air aloft moving. Hence, although we are still expecting scattered thunderstorms in the afternoon, the activity may be slightly less than today. Some storms may still produce strong winds, moderate hail and localized flooding.




Fire Danger Forecast



Burn Ban




Keetch-Byram Drought Index
