


Wind Speeds



Another round of showers and thunderstorms should enter the High Plains from the northwest this evening. A few of these storms could become strong to severe. Damaging winds and hail are the primary hazards.



Scattered showers and thunderstorms will continue to push through Central Texas this morning. Only isolated additional storms are expected this afternoon mainly across the east and southeast parts of the region. Temperatures will be below normal today with highs in the lower 90s.

Today - Risk Level 2 out of 4

- Showers and storms will develop ahead of a frontal system this morning and continue into the afternoon.
- Very heavy downpours will be possible, resulting in a potential for flooding of urban and poor drainage areas. The greater potential will be for upper southeast Texas and central Louisiana.


Today's Forecast


High temperatures will be in the mid 80s to lower 90s.



A weak cold front will move into the area today. Expect isolated to scattered showers and storms across most of the region along with temperatures close to normal for mid-July.






Fire Danger Forecast



Burn Ban




Keetch-Byram Drought Index
