





The best chance for showers and thunderstorms will still favor the western Panhandles. Some of the stronger storms will produce heavy rain and strong gusty winds. Storms should be scattered in coverage today and progress towards the south-southeast.




Rain showers and isolated thunderstorms will be possible mainly in the morning hours today. The highest chances will be in the western South Plains where brief heavy rainfall could also occur with this activity.



Scattered thunderstorms are expected the today and tomorrow, with peak coverage occurring during the afternoon and early evening hours. Severe weather is not expected, but some storms may be capable of producing gusty downburst winds and localized heavy rainfall. Highs will be in the upper 80s and lower 90s.



Areawide rainfall chances return today, beginning in east Texas early and spreading across the region into the afternoon, with the highest overall chances along and south of US Hwy 84.




There is a Marginal (risk level 1 out of 4) to Slight (risk level 2 out of 4) for rainfall capable of producing flash flooding across the area the next couple of days.




Highs in the 90s across South Texas today with a medium (40-60%) chance of showers and thunderstorms. Greatest chances over the Victoria Crossroads. Heat index values will range from 105-109. Light south to southeast winds of 5 to 15 mph.



Another round of showers and thunderstorms are expected to develop today into the afternoon. There will be embedded pockets of heavy rainfall and some instances of flooding could be possible. Thunderstorms and outflow will be capable of produce gusty winds as well.



Central and southern parts of the area (yellow shading on the map) have a Slight Risk (Level 2 out of 4) excessive rainfall from 7 AM today to 7 AM Tuesday.



A cold front will intrude upon West Texas and Southeast New Mexico today, resulting in showers and thunderstorms. Chances will decrease to the south through Wednesday.




Lingering showers will be possible in the morning with more afternoon thunderstorms expected, mainly west of the Rio Grande.






