




Another upper wave will move over the region tonight again bringing the potential for isolated storms.




Showers and isolated thunderstorms are possible across about the eastern half of the region today (Saturday) Otherwise, it will be partly to mostly sunny today with highs in the 80s to the mid 90s. Lows tonight will range from the upper 60s to the middle 70s under a partly cloud sky.



Showers and thunderstorms will impact portions of the Four State region once again today.



Conditions will be favorable for flash flooding. Expect additional rainfall amounts of 1 to 2 inches, with localized heavier amounts possible through Saturday afternoon.



A Flood Watch remains in effect until 1 PM this afternoon.



Showers with isolated thunderstorms are once again expected today with the best chances south of I-10. Highs will only climb into the low 80s.




High temperatures and rain chances for today.



A Flood Watch is in effect for Victoria, Calhoun, Refugio, Aransas, San Patricio and Nueces counties through Sunday evening. Forecasted excessive rainfall may cause minor flooding in urban areas, poor drainage zones, and low-lying regions. Localized flash flooding is also possible in some areas. Locations affected by previous storms may face a higher risk of flooding. Additionally, there may be rises in rivers and small streams.



A slow-moving system will produce another 1-3 inches of rain along the Coastal Bend with locally higher amounts possible. High rainfall rates are expected to cause small creeks and streams to rise out of their banks. Low-lying areas, and urban areas, may see flooding as well.




Isolated to widely scattered showers and thunderstorms continue today with the best chances over eastern areas. Locally heavy rain is possible and may lead to isolated flooding. Below average high temperatures continue and will range from the 80s east to 90s west.







Report of 218 (No Change) fires and 1,250,656 (No Change) acres have been burned this year. There are 86 (No Change) counties with burn bans. The Keetch–Byram Drought Index list contains 91 (+4) counties with an average over 400.
